 The revisions call for the hearing of appeals of violation cases from Freshman Customs Board and from Tribunal or Judicial by a disciplinary subcommittee of the Senate committee on student affairs, rather than by cabinet.
 The revisions have been approved by the Senate of the Women's Student Government Association, the Freshman Customs Board, and Freshman Council.
 A resolution that would substitute the word "university" for "college" and the word "college" for "school" everywhere they appear in the All-College Constitution will be read for the second time. The resolution will be read by David Arnold, All-College secretary-treasurer from last cabinet meeting's minutes. It will be acted upon at the next cabinet meeting.
