
Gymnasts, Boxers in Tourneys

In order to be eligible for the Eastern all-around title, the gymnasts must compete in the latter four events.

Kois, however, will meet The Wilson American in the Lione Wilson American in the Lione Millson International Inte Elmer Wilson, Army, in the Lions only semi-final bout tonight.
