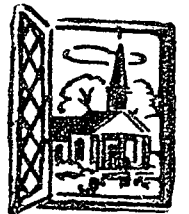

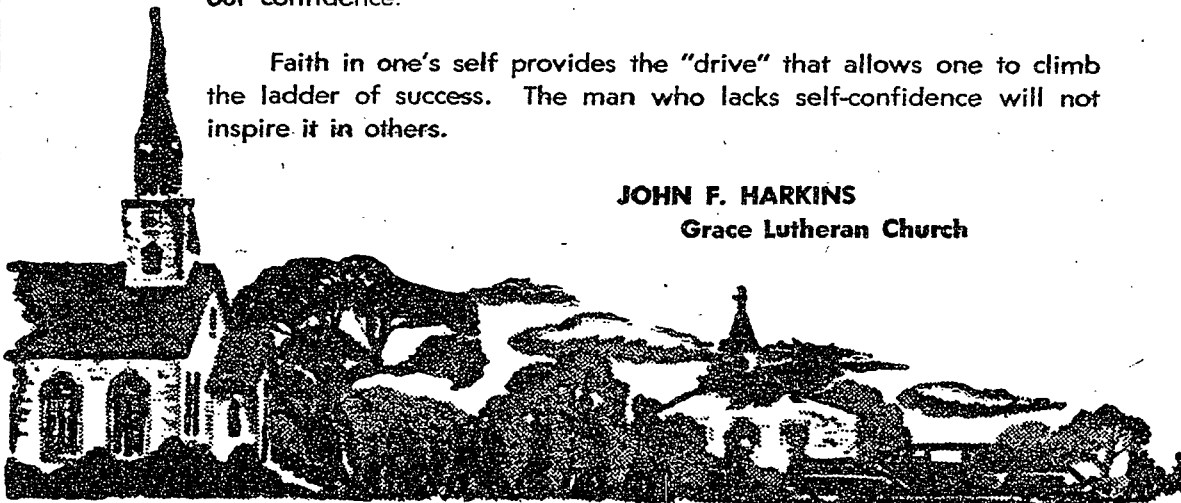


Faith is an essential in every successful life. Faith in God is a requisite to right living. Knowing God as our Creator and Benefactor buttresses man for the trials and temptations of life.
