Richard Kirschner and Benjamin Sinclair will debate the affirmative side of the national debate topic, "Resolved: That the United States should adopt a policy of free trade," for the men.

Ronald Lench and Donald Pripstein are members of the men's negative team.

On the women's affirmative team is Nancy Silverman and Agnes Porter. The women's negative team is composed of Barbara Menapace and Claire Krieger.

Each team will take part in five rounds of debate.

Miss Porter and Kirschner will participate in the extemporaneous speaking contest. George Haines and Margaret Troutman will compete in the oratory contest.

Last year the Penn State women debaters won the state championships in extempore and oratory.

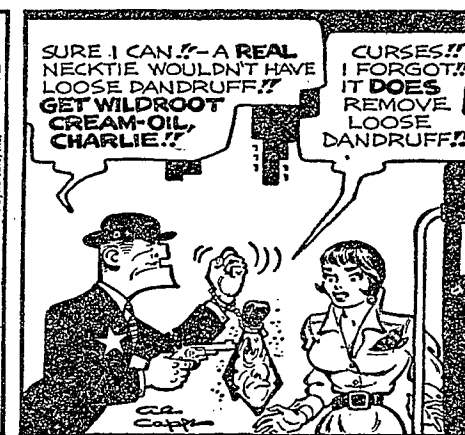
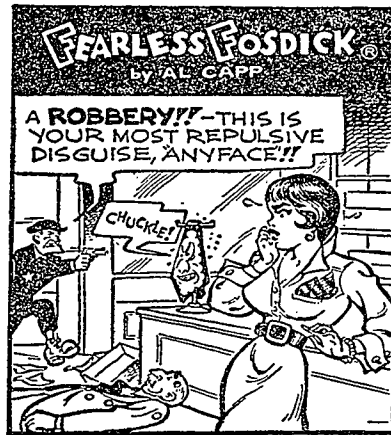

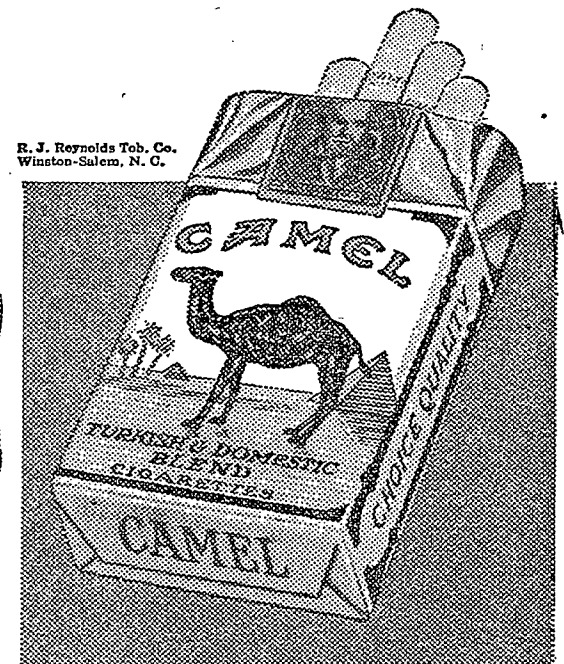
