

# Nittany Group To 'Wait, See' On Merger Plan

Nittany Council decided last night to "wait and see what Pollock Council does" before taking further action on a proposed plan to (1) merge Nittany and Pollock Councils into a proposed East Dorm Council, and (2) to form a single social committee for both areas.

The two-fold plan was originally proposed and approved by the Nittany Council at its meeting Feb. 22, subject to approval by Pollock Council. So far, Pollock Council has failed to act.

Action on the plan to unite the two areas was postponed because the Nittany Council believed the Pollock living area would become obsolete in the near future.

Pollock Council is expected to hear a new constitution covering the proposed merger at its meeting tonight. The constitution has been drawn up by Thomas Kidd, a member of Pollock Council.

This constitution, if approved by both councils, will become an amendment to the council's present constitutions.

George Copella, president of Pollock Council, has indicated three weeks will be needed before any final decision can be made. He said each of the Pollock dormitories will have to vote on the merger.

At present, the Pollock Council is believed to be about evenly divided on the matter.

According to John Shafer, social committee chairman of the Nittany Council, efforts made last week to combine social activities of both areas into one organization have produced no results.

(Continued from page one) McCarthy and Roy Cohn, chief subcommittee counsel, exerted pressure to get favored treatment for draftee G. David Schine, a former nonsalaried member of the subcommittee staff.

2. Countercharges that the Army was holding Schine in "hostage" while it tried to divert McCarthy's investigation of alleged "communist coddling" in the Army to other branches of the military service.

The subcommittee doesn't want Cohn or any other member of its regular staff to take part in the investigation. That's why the hunt is on for a special counsel.

Prizes are awarded to institutions which have notably contributed to dissemination of French culture within the U.S. and the promotion of friendship

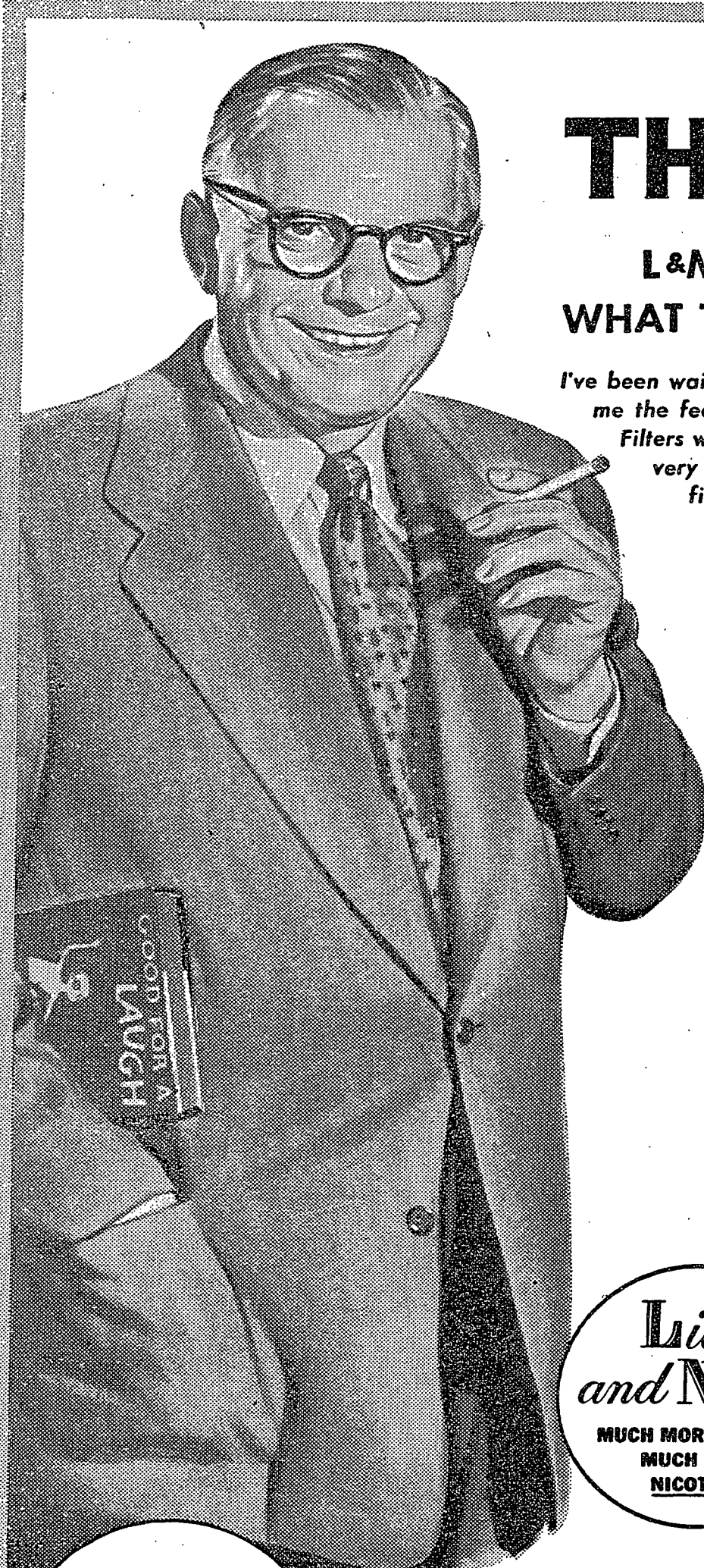
between youth of the two countries.

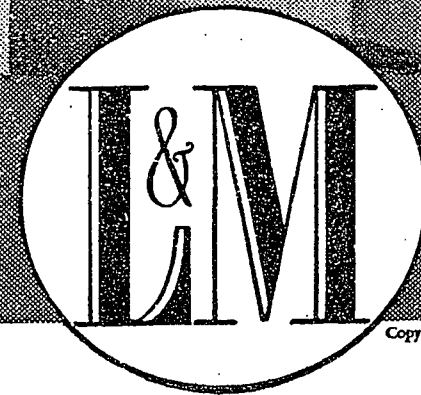
