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two couples as stipulated in the code, or three adults or a part-time housemother.

In addition to the approved chaperon list, IFC had requested chapter alumni be of three years' standing (minimum of 28 years of age) rather than ten years' as provided in the code.

It was requested that with full-time housemothers, dating be permitted in fraternities from noon to 10 p.m. Monday through Thursday, with the stipulation that the

period be used to provide study time only, and from noon until 11 p.m. Sundays.

The only change made was the amendment which changed Sunday dating hours from noon until 8 p.m. to noon until 10 p.m.

In addition to the changes suggested concerning chaperoned dating, IFC asked for changes in the unchaperoned section of the code. However, no changes were made.

Changes suggested by IFC included permitting dating in fraternities without chaperons from noon until 8 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and noon until 11 p.m. Sunday.

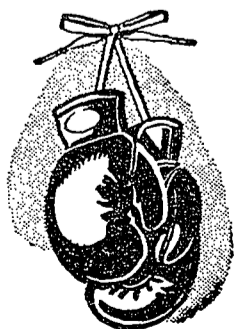
