containing a grand piano and surrounded by seven smaller listening rooms. There will also be an exhibition room for paintings, sculpture, and other University displays.

A large game room providing space for 16 ping pong tables, shuffleboard, and card tables will be found on the ground floor. A large snack bar and dining rooms will also be located on the ground floor along with storage rooms and facilities for employees.

The student-financed Union building, already being copied by other colleges throughout the nation, is being financed by a student assessment of \$10 a semester, faculty contributions and designations from the Alumni fund. Donovan said the centrally located building, which has been in the planning stage since 1937, "will take care of the needs of the Penn State students."

The Board of Trustees also approved the name Sutherland Hall for the main structure at the Ogontz Center. The building honors Abby A. Sutherland, principal of the Ogontz School, who presented the property to the University.

Sutherland Hall serves numerous purposes at the Center besides being its administration building. It provides dormitory facilities

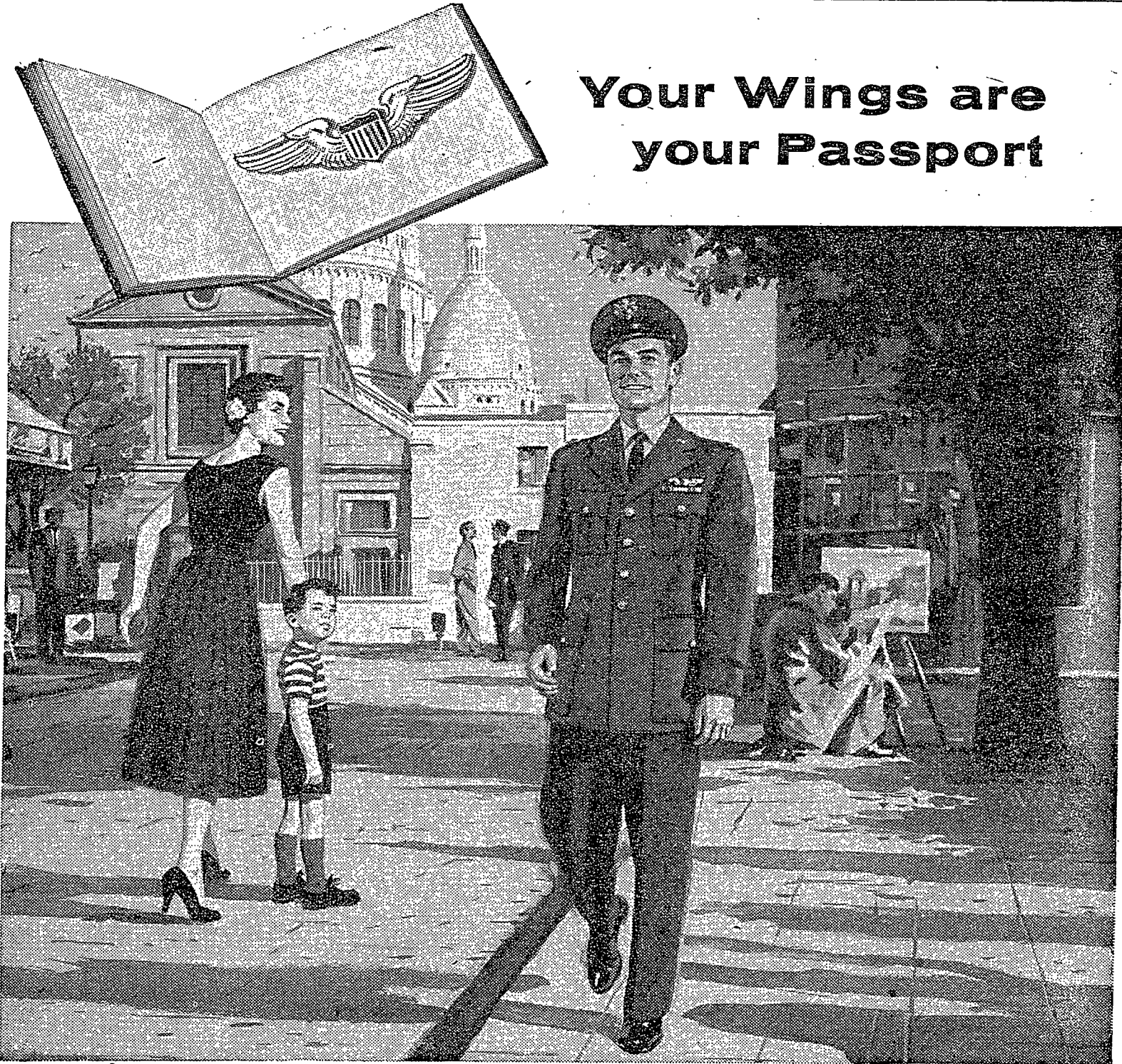
