

# Prexy Recommends Tour by Editors

President Milton S. Eisenhower yesterday told delegates to the Pennsylvania Press Conference that a good-will tour of Latin America by Pennsylvania editors and publishers might make a unique contribution to the cause of inter-American understanding.

Speaking at the annual dinner of the conference at the Nittany Lion Inn, he told the newsmen that such a trip would be one step toward a better understanding of that hemisphere.

Dr. Eisenhower called for a change in criterion of news reporting, editing, and interpreting from one of reader interest to one of reader understanding.

**Others Would Follow Move**  
He said that if such a movement would begin at home, press associations and foreign correspondents would follow suit, and news for readers in the United States from the other America, would begin to take on a new meaning.

The conference will get under-

way again this morning, with a workshop on "Editorial Page Scrutiny" set for 9:30 a.m. in the Assembly Room of the Nittany Lion Inn. G. A. Harshman, editor of the Sharon Herald and secretary-treasurer of the Pennsylvania Society of Newspaper Editors, will lead the discussion.

**Editorial Director to Speak**  
Robert H. Estabrook, editorial page director of the Washington D.C. Post and Times Herald and one of the founders of the National Conference of Editorial Writers, will speak to the workshop.  
James H. Coogan, assistant di-

rector of public information in charge of sports, will lead a discussion on "Is There More to the Sports Page Than Meets the Eye?" at 10:30 a.m.

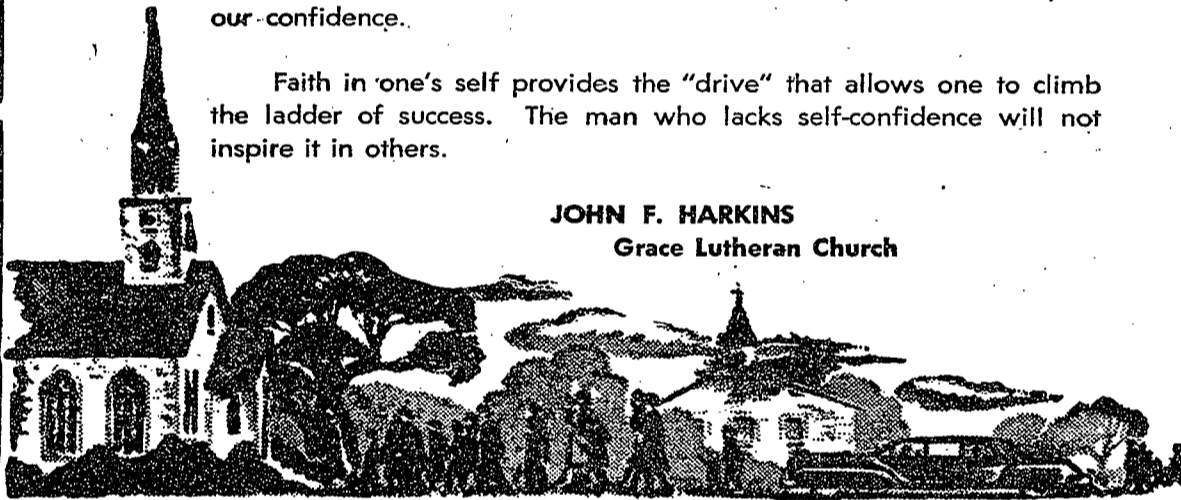
