

Ag Council Opposes Proposed Course

Agriculture Student Council Tuesday night went on record as opposing a proposed course in international relations to be required for students in all courses.

The proposal, which was passed by the Mont Alto student encampment before the beginning of the semester, is expected to come up before All-University Cabinet tonight.

Under the proposal, all students, before the completion of their eighth semester, would be required to enroll in a special course in international relations.

If cabinet passes the proposal, it would have to be approved by the University Senate before going into effect.

Members of council felt they did not have enough time to include the course in their curriculum.

Encampment Resolution

The proposed course was one of four points in a resolution coming from the academic policies committee at encampment aimed at making international understanding play "a great role in every student's education."

Encampment also recommended that the faculty be encouraged to integrate international understanding in all courses, that existing programs encouraging international understanding be better publicized, and that deans encourage students to elect courses in the field.

Council did not discuss the other three points in the resolution.

Presented Trophy

Earl Reinsel, sixth semester forestry major, presented the softball trophy to the Clover Club.

Manley Case, editor of the Ag Hill Breeze, suggested that the paper be issued on Monday instead of Wednesday. In the last issue of the Breeze, Case stated that a Monday edition would give the agriculture students a complete "run-down" of the week's events at the beginning.

Case said that the Daily Collegian published all Breeze stories before the Breeze came out.

Discuss Book Collection

A book collection which the council is planning for the future was discussed. The books will be for the library of Silliman University in the Philippines. Council hopes to have the collection include books other than those pertaining to agriculture.

Town Council May Organize Turkey Shoot

Tentative plans for a turkey shoot were discussed by Town Council last night, although a definite time and place were not agreed upon.

Council will await the report of Edwin Dull, fifth semester animal husbandry major, appointed last week as head of a committee to formulate plans.

Other new business included the election of vice president and several appointments made by president Donald Weidner. Ray Rubner, fifth semester agriculture education major, defeated William Hodgson, third semester mechanical engineering major, by an 8 to 4 vote for the vice presidency.

Weidner called to the council's attention the need for an office from which he and the secretary could operate. Weidner said he believed there was a good chance that the council might be granted an office in Waring Hall. He appointed Joseph Janus, third semester forestry major, as head of a committee to ask for an office.

Rubner was named head of a committee to explore the possibilities of acquiring a downtown building in which social functions of the council could be held.

The Arnold Air Society will hold its annual rushing smoker at 8:15 p.m. Tuesday at Phi Sigma Kappa. The dress will be class A uniforms.

All advanced Air ROTC students with a 1.5 all-University average and a 2.0 air science average are eligible for membership.
