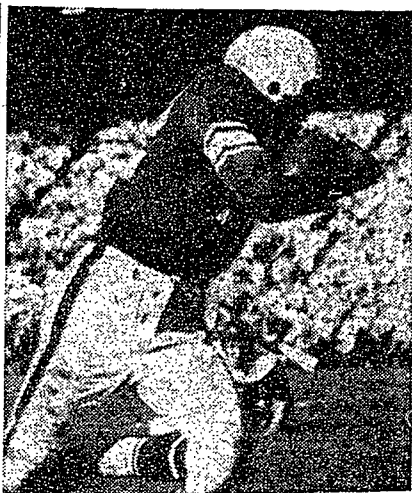
More than 30,000 fans are expected to attend today, breaking the record of 30,321 set in 1951 against Michigan State. Permanent seating was sold out more than a week ago and temporary bleacher seats have been erected.

Two former Penn State coaches, Bob Higgins and the late Hugo Bezdek, will be honored at special halftime ceremonies when they will be installed in the National Football Hall of Fame. Higgins, who coached Penn State teams from 1930 to 1949 will accept his plaque from Adm. John H. Brown, president of the Hall of Fame. Bezdek will be represented by his daughter, Mrs. Frances Bezdek McKinstry.

Athletic director, Ernest McCoy, will accept duplicate plaques for the University.

The game will be broadcast locally by radio station WMAJ, with Bob Prince doing the announcing, and will also be carried by the Columbia Broadcasting System on the "Football Roundup" show.

This is Rip Engle's tenth year as a college football coach, his fifth at Penn State. He formerly coached at Brown University.

Cross-Country Squad to Meet Champion Spartan Harriers

Michigan State's Big Ten and IC4A cross-country champions will tangle with the Lions' at 11 a.m. today on the golf course.

Penn State has dropped its two meets so far this season. This will be the opening meet of the campaign for the Spartans.

Although Michigan State Coach Karl Schlademan lost his five top stars from last year's title-winning squad, he has the services of four promising sophomores. John Cook, Spartan captain, is one of the five men Schlademan will have to do without. He is scholastically ineligible. Schlademan's four top sophomores during practice sessions were Selwyn Jones, Terry Block, Gay Denslow, and Bob Skane. The Michigan State-Penn State rivalry is one of the keenest in the hill-and-dale ranks. Nittany Coach Chink Werner has come up with a winning combination three times in the past five encounters.

Doug Moorhead, ace Lion harrier, is expected to lead the way for the Blue and White. Other top runners for the Lions include Ted Garrett, Jim Pastorius, Gene McKelvey, and John Chillrud. Werner also has a quartet of speedy sophomores—Don Woodrow, Dick Mohler, Paul Roberts, and Don Mowry.

Moorhead has been the Lions' top runner this season, finishing first in a triangular meet with Navy and Villanova and second against Cornell.

Michigan State may be loaded with sophomore talent, but the blossoms of spring often fade in the summer heat.

Strike Settlement Fails in London

LONDON, Oct. 15 (AP)—Efforts to settle the strike of 24,000 dockers which has shut down London's busy port collapsed tonight and the government warned that Britain's food supplies and export trade were endangered. Coupled with a spreading busmen's walkout and an order for a mass strike by Thames River tugmen, the dock stoppage confronted Prime Minister Winston Churchill's government with the most serious labor crisis since it came to power three years ago.
