

Lee Vincent Orchestra Slated for Belle-Hop Ball

Lee Vincent and his orchestra will return again this year to play for the Belle-Hop Ball. After a hard eight-year struggle, Vincent is coming to the top with his recent recording of "Penn State Hop" and "Tonight My Sweet."

This is Vincent's fourth appearance on campus. Besides playing at last year's Belle-Hop Ball he has also appeared at fraternity dances.

When Vincent first began his orchestra, he started on a small scale with local musicians. To keep going the members worked during the day and performed at night. Many of the local original members have gone on to big name orchestras.

During his eight years of work, Vincent has appeared with such people as Nat King Cole, Joni James, Billy Eckstein, Eddie Fisher, and Hugo Winterhalter.

Vincent is known for his danceable music. According to him, if people want listening music, they turn on the radio, but if they come to hear a band they want to be able to dance.

The Belle-Hop Ball will be held this Saturday night from 8:30 to midnight in Recreation Hall.

Tickets are on sale at the Student Union desk in Old Main and may be obtained from members of the Hotel Greeters Association.

Highlighting the dance will be the selection of Mr. Penn State by the audience. The five finalists will be announced Wednesday Theofilos Balabanis, chairman of the ball, has announced.

date of the appointment, meaning two weeks prior to final cabinet approval of the appointment. Advance notice of the positions open as well as application procedures will be published in the Daily Collegian at least two weeks prior to the final interviewing date. Application forms are to be available to all students and to be distributed wherever the committee deems most appropriate.

The committee will be directly responsible to the All-University president, and shall report all interviews to him.

The recommendations made to the president, however, will not be binding on him.

The chairman of the Intercollegiate Council Board will serve as committee chairman. In addition,

the chairman of the committee for whom applications are being interviewed will be considered an ex-officio member of the interviewing committee.

The committee was established after an amendment presented by Robert Dennis, president of the Association of Independent Men, was declared unconstitutional by Cabinet parliamentarian Thomas Kidd. Cabinet then sustained All-University President Jesse Arnette, upholding Kidd's decision, after Dennis had appealed Arnette's decision.

According to Dennis' amendment, the dean of men would act as adviser to the interviewing committee when the members of Tribunal and Traffic Court were being considered, and the dean of women would act as adviser when the interviewing committee considered the members of Judicial.

Judicial Exempt

The section concerning Judicial was immediately dropped when Patricia Ellis, president of the Women's Student Government Association, pointed out that the method of selecting Judicial members was prescribed in the Constitution of WSGA.

Kidd said the provision for selecting the members of Tribunal and Traffic Court was unconstitutional because the method of selection of these posts was prescribed in the All-University Constitution.

Dennis defended his amendment by saying that it provided for selection in the matter as prescribed by the All-University

Constitution after CPIC had acted on the appointees.

Kidd then charged that the issue was not over the wording but the "spirit" of the Constitution. Kidd said the courts should have some say in the group that would be selected for the following year.

Committee to Nominate

Under the All-University Constitution, nominations to Tribunal and Judicial shall be made by a committee composed of the presiding Tribunal and Judicial chairmen, a representative of the WSGA Senate and the All-University president. The All-University president serves as chairman of the committee. The dean of men and the dean of women serve as ex-officio members of the committee.

Nominations for Tribunal and Judicial chairmen must be approved by cabinet one month before the end of the spring semester. Other appointments to Tribunal and Judicial must be made two weeks before the end of the spring semester.

Psych Tests Interpreted

Students in the College of Chemistry and Physics or Liberal Arts who took the psychology tests during Orientation Week may have their test results interpreted for them by making an appointment at the Psychological Clinic, basement of Women's Building. Test results for other colleges will be available in about two weeks.

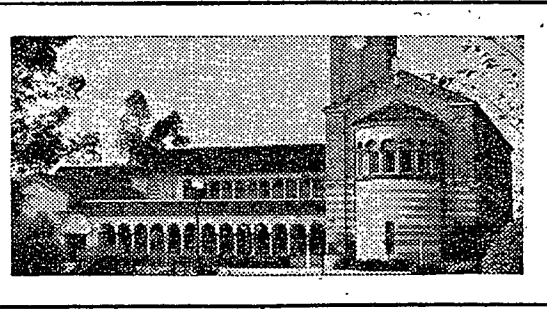

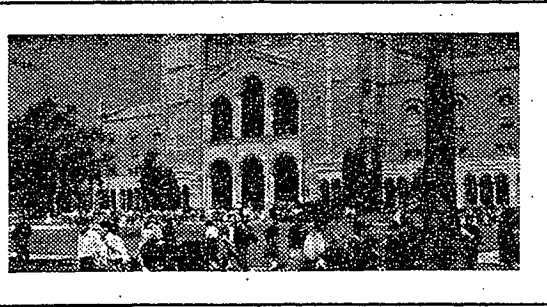
