Rees Slated To Speak At Chapel

The Rev. Elfan Rees, adviser of refugee affairs to the World Council of Churches and secretary of the Commission of the Churches on International Affairs in Geneva, Switzerland, will speak at Chapel services at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

His subject will be "The Century of the Homeless Man."

Rees was born in Brecon, Wales, and graduated from Oxford University. He studied theology at Mansfield College and Oxford. He was ordained into the Congregational ministry in 1930.

In 1934 Rees was appointed director of the South Wales Council of Social Service and in 1938 he was elected chairman of the Welsh committee for the care of refugees.

After three years of service as a wing commander in the Royal Air Force in Wales, Rees became senior welfare specialist for the Balkan Commission of UNRRA in 1944.

In 1947 he was appointed director of the Refugee Division of the World Council Department of Relief and Reconstruction, and in 1949 became its special adviser on refugee affairs.

SS Test Slips Ready Monday

Applications for the Selective Service College Qualification test will be available at the Dean of Men's office, 109 Old Main, beginning Monday.

The test will be given Dec. 9 at the University. The deadline for mailing applications is midnight, Nov. 23.

The test is used by local draft boards to determine a student's eligibility for scholastic deferment. However, a passing grade on the examination does not insure deferment, nor does a failing grade mean the student automatically will be drafted.

Students must show their selective service registration cards when they pick up applications. To be eligible for the exam, a student must be taking a full-time college course.
