The Rev. Elfan Rees, adviser of refugee affairs to the World Council of Churches and secretary of the Commission of the Churches on International Affairs in Geneva, Switzerland, will speak at Chapel services at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

His subject will be "The Century of the Homeless Man."

Rees was born in Brecon, Wales, and graduated from Oxford University. He studied theology at Montfield College and Oxford Homes. Mansfield College and Oxford. He was ordained into the Congregational ministry in 1930.

In 1934 Rees was appointed director of the South Wales Council of Social Service and in 1938 he was elected chairman of the Welsh committee for the care of

After three years of service as a wing commander in the Royal Air Force in Wales, Rees became senior welfare specialist for the Balkan Commission of UNRRA in

In 1947 he was appointed director of the Refugee Division of the World Council Department of Relief and Reconstruction, and in 1949 became its special adviser on refugee affairs.
