

# Lions to Battle Jaspers In Final Dual Meet

Schoolboy cross-country runners competing in today's PIAA championship race at the University will get a glimpse of some harriers who ran in the same event several years ago. Three Penn State harriers—Ted Garrett, Jim Pastorius, and Don Woodrow—competed in the PIAA title run while in high school. All three will be running for the Lions against Manhattan right after the high school run for the roses.

The PIAA race will start at 11 a.m.

Meet time for the Manhattan-Penn State clash is about 11:30 a.m. The runners will start and finish on the Beaver Field track.

Garrett, who ran for Ambridge High School, holds the record for the PIAA championship race. Pastorius competed for Brentwood High School, and Woodrow for Perry.

Today's clash will be the final competition for the Lions before the IC4A and NCAA championships. The IC4A run will be held Nov. 15 and the NCAA race will be a week later.

Penn State will be seeking its sixth straight win over the Jaspers. Last year the Lions trounced Manhattan at Van Cortlandt Park, N.Y., 17-41.

Only three Penn State runners who finished in the top ten last year against the Jaspers will be running today. Doug Moorhead, Nittany captain today, finished in a three-way tie for first place last year. Garrett crossed the finish line in fifth place and John Chillrud came in eighth. Moorhead's winning time was 26:22.

Manhattan will have only two runners back from the top ten

finishers last year. Jim DeBraggio, who finished fourth, and Bob Goodwin, Manhattan captain, who was tenth, are the returnees.

Bob Sbara, Manhattan's top runner, was unable to compete last season due to an operation which sidelined him for the year.

Behind DeBraggio, Goodwin, and Sbara, Jasper Coach George Eastment has two other top-flight runners—Phil Rios and Bill St.

Clair. Penn State Coach Chick Werner will be counting heavily on Garrett, Pastorius, Woodrow, and Chillrud in an attempt to keep the Lions supremacy over Manhattan. Other key runners for the Lions are sophomores Paul Roberts and Don Mowry and senior Gene McKelvey. Bruce Austin and Dick Mohler round out the squad.

## Bullis to Meet Lion Cubs

Penn State's freshman football team will oppose Bullis Academy at 10 a.m. today in its first and only home appearance of the year. The Lion cubs beat Navy and tied Pitt in their two prior starts, both on foreign soil.
