

Elections --

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In the sophomore class race, Samuel Wolcott, Lion, was elected by 447 to 251 over Clinton Law, State. The vice presidency went to Theodore Simon, Lion, who received 396 votes to 300 for George Haines, State. Martha Fleming, Lion, was elected secretary-treasurer over Kaye Buterbaugh, State, by 422 to 273.

John Spangler, State, defeated George Wills, Lion, for the freshman class vice presidency 681 to 551. Lion Party took the freshman class secretary-treasurer post as Barbara Kinnier defeated Gail Smith 737 to 498.

The light vote was attributed by Ernest Famous, Elections Committee chairman, to the parties' not using sound trucks yesterday to remind students of the election.

In past years sound trucks have toured the campus on elections day urging students to vote.

Famous said the parties probably could not afford to pay for the trucks because they were allowed to spend only \$150 for publicity. He said sound trucks will be used to encourage students to vote in the All-University elections even if the Elections Committee has to pay the expense.

changes in the constitution. The others involved merely a reordering of the constitution as it stands.

The two amendments advocating change were as follows:

An amendment to article 1 section 2 of the constitution changing it to read that in case of a vacancy on Cabinet the vice president of an organization shall replace the president in case he is unable to attend and that the hierarchy as established by the constitution of that organization shall determine further succession.

The other change provides that the Tribunal chairman shall swear in all Cabinet officers, and all class presidents. Under article 2 section 3 of the present constitution, this function is delegated to the All-University president, after he has been sworn in by the Tribunal chairman.

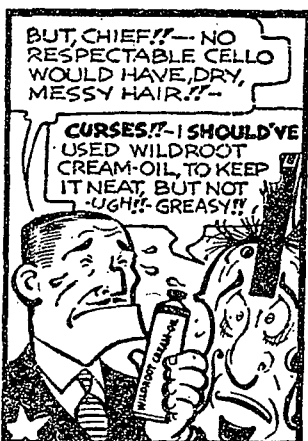
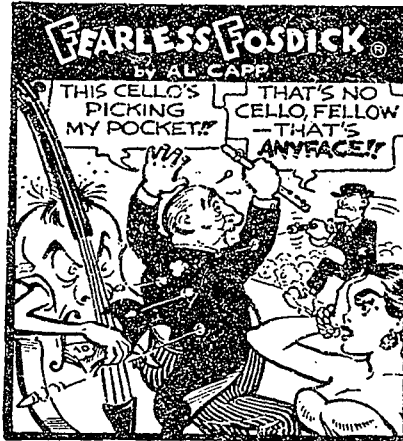

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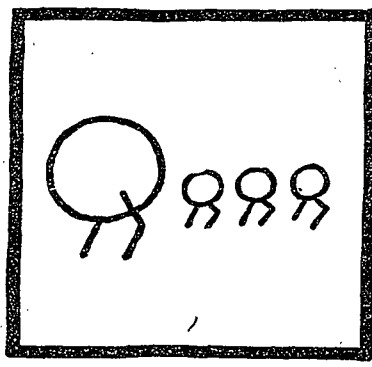
32.7 per cent voted, and last year that percentage dropped to 27 per cent.

In the sophomore elections last year, State party copped the presidential and secretary-treasurer posts, while the Lion Party scored in the vice presidential race.

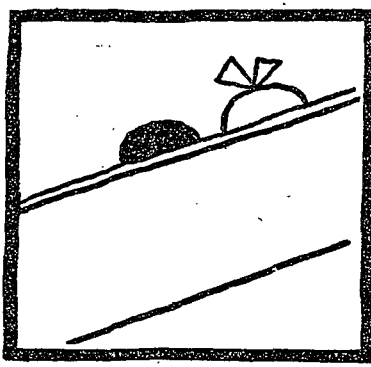

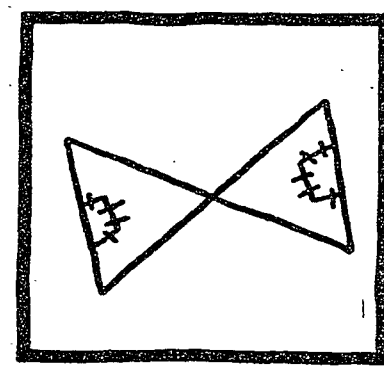

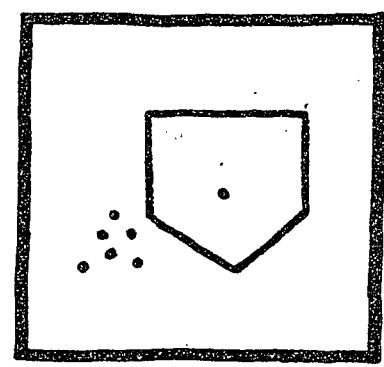
