taken to dinner at their best hotel. Everywhere she went the people welcomed her and tried to impress her with how much they had improved in the past few years. In another city, she was introduced to upper class Yugoslavic society. An acquaintance there attempted to prove to her that the church wasn't persecuted in Yugoslavia. He showed her an open

shrine where the people could pray in the street. When she asked to visit a church, however, she was told the doors were locked just then. In Yugoslavia, the church is treated like a business concern in the hope that some day the people will not need it, Dr. Bernard said.

Yugoslavians feel that any improvement in living conditions

may be attributed to breaking with Russia and not to American aid, she said.

Dr. Bernard also saw a ballet, the symbol of the Yugoslavia culture. It was presented in a run-down theatre, she said.

Dr. Bernard said documentary movies are shown on walls in the streets where throngs of people may stand and watch them.
