Regarding the seond case, four first semester students were in-volved in a water battle on the first floor of McKee Hall following the Pitt-Penn State football game. Their floor counselor re-ported that water had run beneath one door and some shaving cream was splattered over one door and a participant. The board recommended that

the students receive disciplinary probation for one calendar year and that letters regarding the board's action be sent home to their parents.
