Penn State, battling a mountainous height disadvantage, outshot powerful North Carolina State from the floor last night, but couldn't make up the foul shot difference and lost to the top-ranked Wolfpack 99-77 before 12,000 at Reynolds Collesium in Raleigh, N.C.

The Lions connected on 28 field goals, two more than coach Everett Case's quintet, but watched the Wolfpack pile on a cushioned lead from the foul line where they scored an unbelievable 47 points on 59 attempts. The Lions went to the charity line 29 times, connecting on 21.


