

The Lion center tossed in 29 markers and Blocker-who played a brilliant defensive game—scored 15 points in his best single night of the sea-

The Lions opened fast and piled up a quick lead on the Middies. Arnelle, Ron Weidenhammer, and Bob Hoffman spurred an early scoring burst, and it wasn't until after five minutes had elapsed that guard Larry Wigley con-nected for the first Navy score.

The Nittanies could do no wrong for the first 10 minutes and led 28-14 at the mid-point of the half. Navy finally began to move in the late minutes of the half and closed the gap to 40-30 at the intermission.
