"We know of some people we would like to run," he said, "but the final decision in the nominations rests with the clique."

Gordon Pogal, Lion party clique chairman, said last night he was not surprised to hear of the party's formation.

"If the Campus party sincerely intends to follow through with its convictions, I believe it is basically sound. However, I have reason to believe the nucleus of this organization is based more on resentment than on an earnest campaign for better student government," Pogal said.

Commenting on the effect the movement might have on Lion party, he added, "The Lion party will continue to function as it has in the past with the exception of those few persons who have decided to join the ranks of the Campus party. This will be of no consequence to us, because our organization is basically strong and has been further strengthened by our new constitution."

Rae DelleDonne, State party clique chairman, said the third party came as no surprise.

"I wish the former vice clique chairman of State party luck on his new venture, but the motives behind it are glaringly obvious. The Campus party movement has taken no strength from the State party," she said.

De Levie Tries Radio Language Experimentation

Teaching of a foreign language by short wave radio is being experimented by Dr. Dagobert de Levie, assistant professor of German at the University.

The plan is designed to supplement the classroom instruction with short wave news broadcasts in German.

"I believe that with the aid of short wave receivers students can develop their ability to understand a foreign language as spoken by a native at normal speed," Dr. Levie said.

Dr. Philip A. Shelly, professor and head of the department of German, announced that two German films and several records in German will be used by the department in teaching German 4 for the spring semester.

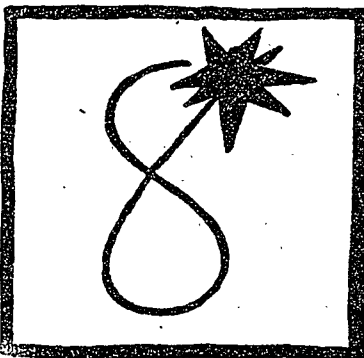
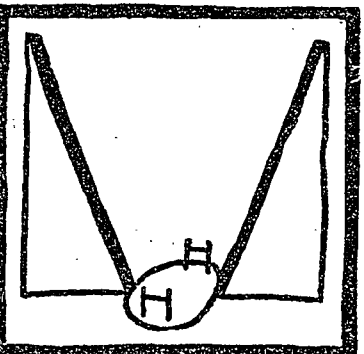
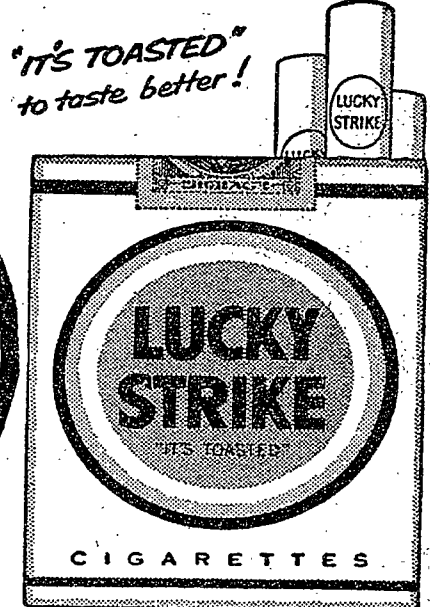
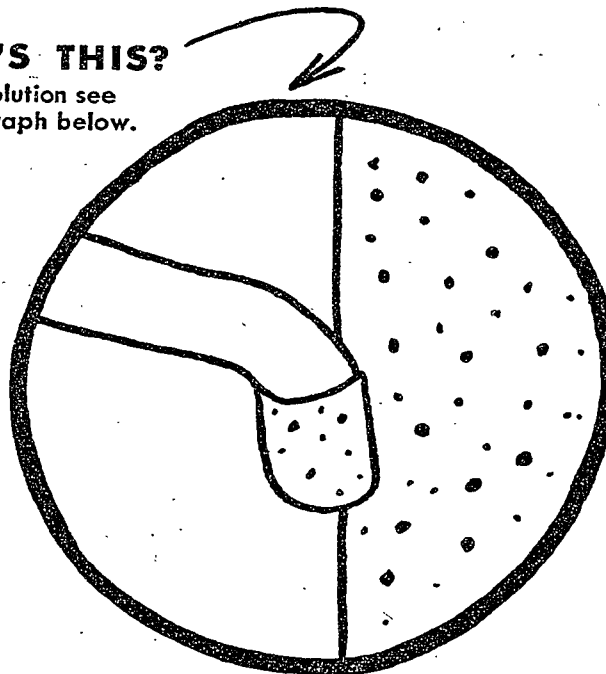


FIGURE EIGHT SKATED ON THIN ICE

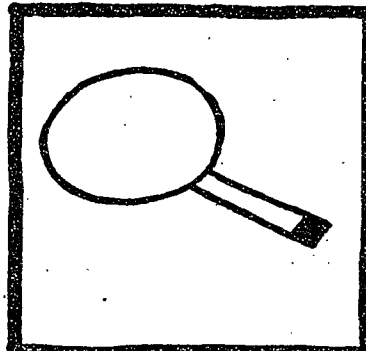

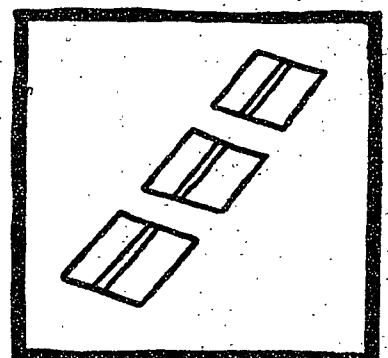
