

# Iowa Wallops Nittanies, 82-53

## Hoffman Scores 14 For Losers

(Continued from page one) with four minutes remaining before the intermission, trailed 30-13.

The Nittanies, however, showed a little more life before the half ended. Iowa brought the count to 33-14 then Bob Hoffman cut the nets with a jump from the pivot and Rudy Marisa scored on a lay-up. Davis scored from underneath and added a free throw making the score, 36-21. Bob Rohland tossed in two free throw attempts and Arnelle fired in a jump from the pivot after Davis cut a set from the side and Cain scored on a foul shot.

The score read 39-25 at the half.

The Hawkeyes continued their scoring rampage after the intermission. With Cain and Davis leading the way, they battered the Lions from all angles. Only Hoffman, finding the range from outside the Iowa man-for-man screen, was able to score with any consistency for the Lions.

Hoffman scored eight points during the opening ten minutes but Iowa poured it on and built the lead to 49-31 with only four minutes gone in the second half. Davis, Cain, and center Bill Logan did most of the damage and the Iowans moved out in front by 20 points, 57-37, at the midpoint of the half.

Iowa by this point was running away with little difficulty. They continued the pace through the rest of the game. Both coaches allowed their substitutes to finish and the Lions were never within a long reach of contention for the rest of the way. Iowa finished going away, 82-53.

Iowa's top scorers were Cain, Davis and Seaburg. Cain dumped 19, Davis, 17, and Seaburg, 13. The Hawkeyes hit on 45.9 per cent of their shots.

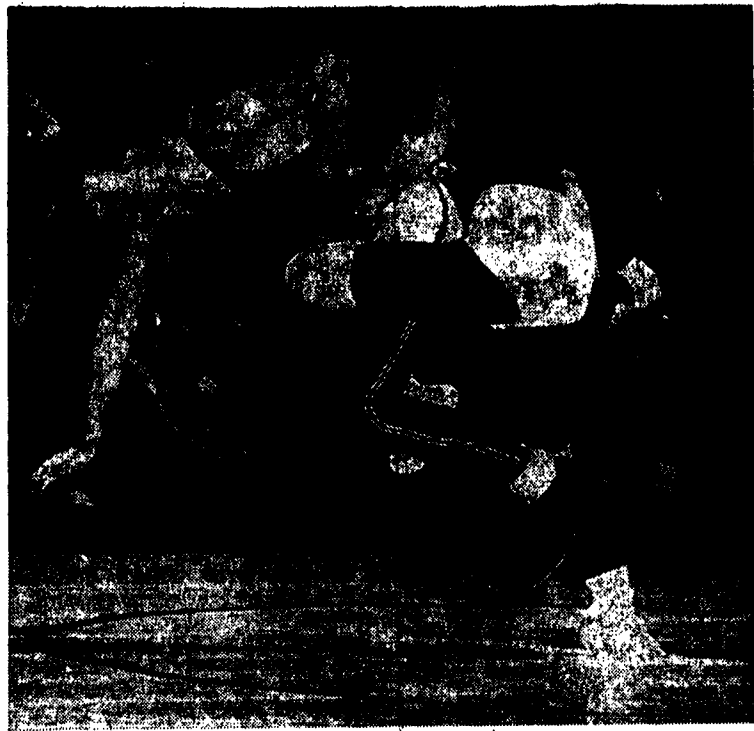
### Phillies Nip White Sox

Seven of Penn State's eight entries won to earn their bouts in last night's quarter finals. Three Lions won by pins—Homan, Krufka, and Oberly—while Nodland, Adams, Fornicola, and Humphreys won by decisions.

In the 130 pound and 137 pound classes byes were awarded to one man in each weight. Men who registered one-point decisions; therefore, in either weight, were not awarded points although they advanced. Men who scored pins, however, in either weight were awarded one point for their team scores and advanced to the quarter finals.

Nodland, Lion 123 pounder, defeated Leo Sheehan of Navy who had a 1-5 record, 5-0. Nodland rode Sheehan throughout the second period after getting the takedown in the first period. He reversed Sheehan in the final period for two more points and picked up a point for riding time.

At 137 pounds Homan scored a fall over Chuck Root of Syracuse at 4:13 to gain another one pointer for Penn State's team score. Homan led 6-0 when he scored the pin over Root who had a 1-1 season card.

## Arnelle Named To AP All-State Basketball Team

Penn State center Jesse Arnelle has been named to the Associated Press' 1955 All-State basketball team. Arnelle was named to the team with Duquesne's Dick Ricketts and St. Green, LaSalle's Tom Gola, and Maurice Stokes of St. Francis.

Bob Hoffman and Ron Weidenhammer, were given honorable mention.

The first team averages 6-5 in height, 215 in weight, scores a combined 115 points a game, and picks off 100 rebounds a game. Three of the members, Gola, Arnelle, and Stokes have reached the 2000-point scoring circle and Ricketts is just 101 points short of that mark.

Only five coaches have tutored the Penn State basketball team in the 56 years that the sport has been at the University.

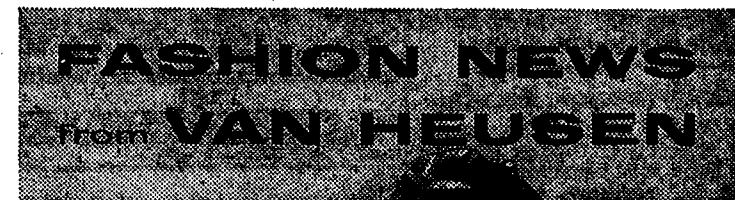

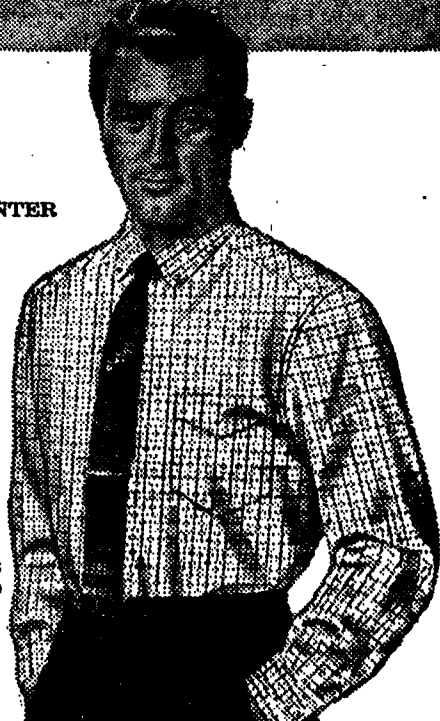

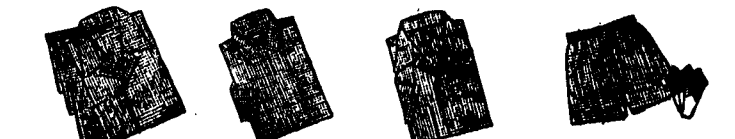
