

## Mollegen To Speak At Seminar

Dr. Albert T. Mollegen, professor of Christian Ethics at the Protestant Episcopal Seminary, Alexandria, Va., will present two lectures at the Faculty Seminar to be held tomorrow and Sunday in the Student Union Building.

The theme of the conference will be "The Faculty Looks at Contemporary Religious Thinking." Group discussions will follow the addresses by Dr. Mollegen.

"Critical Approach to Bible Revelation" is the topic of Dr. Mollegen's lecture at 2 p.m. tomorrow. He will speak on "Revelation's Native Language and Ours" at 8:45 p.m. tomorrow.

The seminar is sponsored by the University Christian Association and the Middle Atlantic region, Student Christian Movement faculty committee. It was begun three years ago and has always been an intercollegiate event.

Registration will begin at 10 a.m. tomorrow, and the seminar will end following Chapel services Sunday.

All faculty members may attend, according to the Rev. Luther H. Harshbarger, University chaplain.

Dr. Mollegen will speak at the Chapel services at 10:55 a.m. Sunday, to the philosophy 18 class at 10 a.m. Monday, and to the Faculty Luncheon Club at noon Monday. He will also be the Centennial lecture speaker at 8 p.m. Monday.
