Each year a group of college women, not more than one from each state, are selected by the Danforth Foundation to receive Dan throughout the country.

The Foundation chooses women who have shown qualifications for aiding the religious lives of students. During the summer they receive a five-week training period at Camp

university campuses throughout the nation and supports them for one year. The graduate is sent to a campus at least 1000 miles from her home. At the end of the year she is under no obligations to
