

1955 NCAA Wrestling Champions

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONS of the 25th National Collegiate Athletic Association wrestling tournament at Cornell last weekend are Terry McCann, Iowa, 115; Ed Peery, Pitt's 123-pound champ; Myron Roderick, Oklahoma A and M, 130-pound champ who copped the 137-pound title last year; Larry Fornicola, Penn State, at 137-pounds; Ed Eichelberger, Lehigh, 147-pound titlist, who was voted the Outstanding Wrestling trophy; Bill Weick, Iowa State Teachers

who regained the 157-pound crown which he won in 1952; Fred Davis, Oklahoma A and M, at 167 pounds; Dan Hodge, Oklahoma's 177-pound champion; Pete Blair, Navy, who was the only man who successfully defended his 1953 crown by winning the 191 title; and Penn State's Bill Oberly, heavyweight champ. Fornicola holds the second-place team trophy of the Lions; Roderick holds the team trophy for Oklahoma A and M's championship team.

4 Teams in Race For IM Mat Title

The race for the intramural fraternity wrestling title will apparently go right down to the wire with four teams fighting it out for the coveted championship.

Phi Gamma Delta jumped prominently in the mat picture when it collected a total of 28 points during the last two nights of intramural action.

Lynn Sweigard swelled the Phi Gam stock, and at the same time dealt the Chi Phi squad a serious blow, when he decisioned Jack Fry, 3-0. However, Chi Phi's position was maintained when Don Farmello pinned Dave Miller, Beaver House, in a 121 match. Farmello was trailing Miller, 2-0, when he applied a half-nelson and crotch hold at 3:41 of the second period.

The surprise of the evening occurred in the 121 division when Phi Gamma Delta's Hartley Blaha defeated Ray Okamoto, Phi Kappa Sigma, on a referee's decision, 7-6. Blaha's near fall and predicament swayed the nod in his favor to break the 6-6 tie. Blaha will meet Farmello, Chi Phi, for the 121 title in Thursday night's finals.

Dick Davidson, 128, kept the Phi Gam machine rolling when he pinned Larry Roman, Alpha Epsilon Pi, in 4:35 with a body press. Fred Bridge also pinned Dave Jones with three seconds remaining in an independent match.

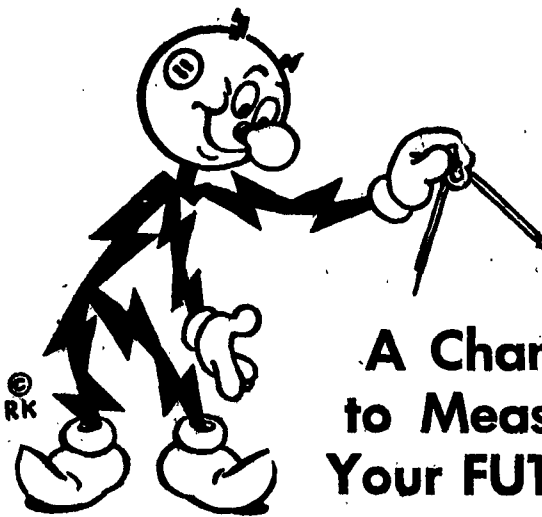
