ture, and Liberal Arts colleges. The report asks the adoption of a two-year terminal curriculum in accounting leading to an Associate in Accounting degree for the College of Business Administration.

The Senate Committee on Educational Policy will present revisions to the report of the Basic College Committee which the Senate heard on Feb. 10.

A copy of the revisions was not available yesterday.

No action was taken on the basic college report which would establish a four-phase program of counseling and testing at the University.

The report recommends:
1) A program undertaken before a student matriculates to determine if he is proper university material.

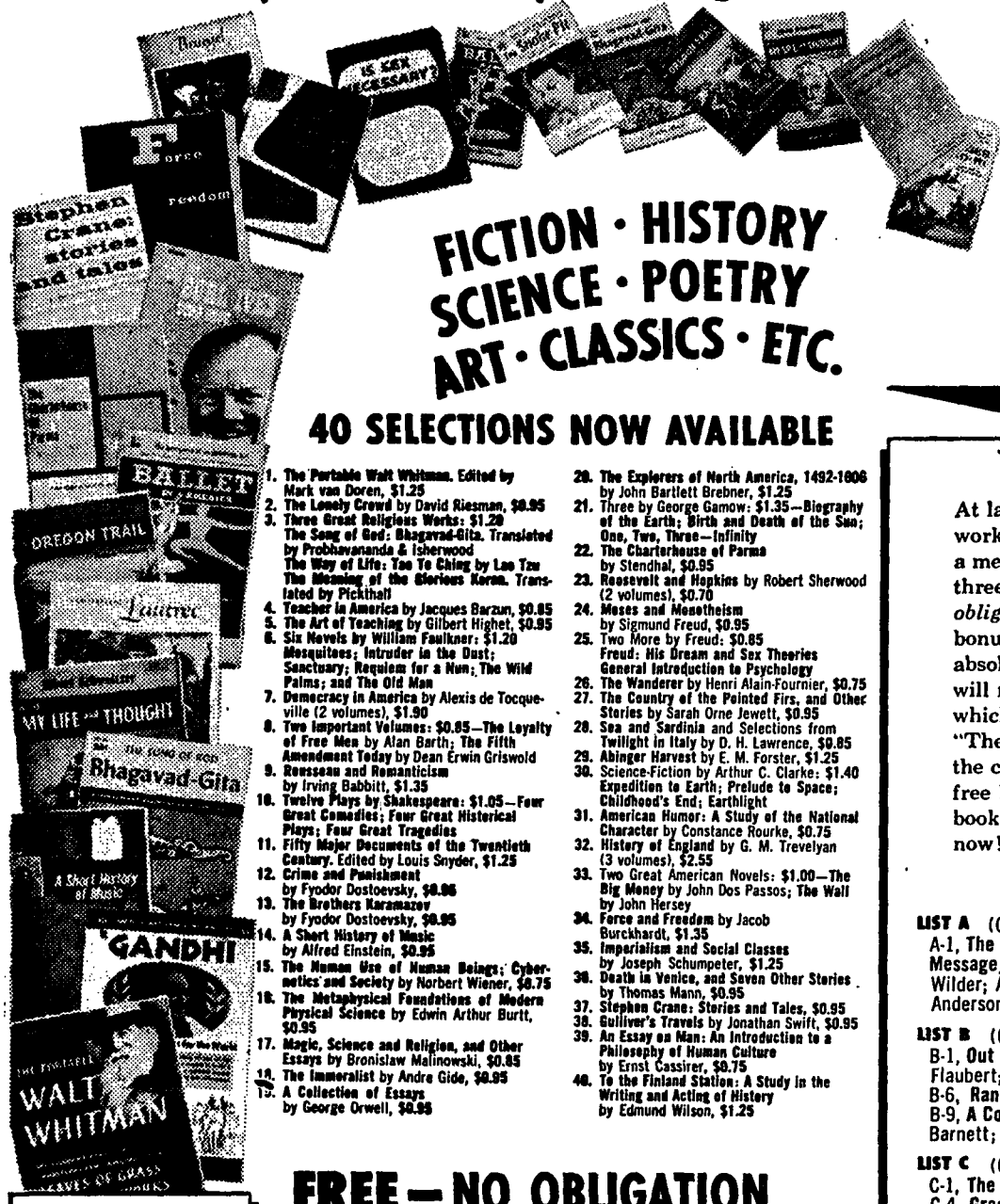
