

# Dye, Davies Win Clique Elections

Allen Davies, fourth semester pre-medical major, was elected Campus party clique chairman, and Thomas Dye, fourth semester labor-management relations major, was elected clique chairman of the Lion party on Sunday.

Dye's election, which was unopposed, came after Robert Spadaro, outgoing clique chairman, announced last week he would not seek reelection.

Elected vice-clique chairman of Campus party was Harold Dean, sixth semester education major. Other newly elected officers were Curtin Schafer, fourth semester student, treasurer; Betty Wilton, fourth semester home economics major, recording secretary; and Nancy Scholl, fourth semester education major, executive secretary.

Campus party amended its constitution to set up an advisory board composed of five members and a chairman. They will have no voting power on the committee.
