

# LA Council Suggests Plan To Aid Frosh

The Liberal Arts Student Council Monday night discussed its program for next fall, and suggested starting a Big-Sister-Brother program to help liberal arts freshmen.

Upperclassmen would contact their little sister or brother over the summer, and answer their questions about college life and the liberal arts.

Over 400 liberal arts freshmen are expected to be enrolled by next fall. Lists will be posted in sororities, fraternities, and freshman women's dormitories for those who would like to sign up as big sisters and brothers.

The council will also revise its constitution. It feels that a 1.5 All-University average, which members are now required to have, may be too high as no other council's requirements are this high, Lawrence Adler, president, said.

In addition to the coffee hours, the Council will hold a faculty-student mixer next fall. An editor for the LA Lantern will be chosen.
