

Local Girl to Star In 'Philly Story'

State College residents can boast of having one of their local girls in the cast of "The Philadelphia Story." Betty Rice, seventh semester arts and letters major, will star in the lead role of Tracy in the Penn State Players' production at 8 tonight, tomorrow, and Saturday in Schwab Auditorium.

Miss Rice is not a newcomer to University stage productions. She has appeared in "Lute Song," "Deidere of the Sorrows," and "The Corn is Green," and has been one of the most prolific writers of original one-act plays for 5 O'Clock Theatre. Miss Rice also appeared in a summer stock production of "Standing Stone" last summer.

Played 'Bit' Parts

Miss Rice said (from underneath an evening gown change at dress rehearsal) that she used to play 'bit' parts in State College High School dramatics.

"The Philadelphia Story" is Philip Barry's comedy of life on Philadelphia's Main Line. The play circulates around the approaching marriage of Tracy to her second husband.

Miss Rice, in her role as Tracy, plays "rich, rapacious, sophisticated" socialite. In commenting on the nature of the role and her attitude toward it, Miss Rice said, "I'd like to carry over some of Tracy's characteristics outside of the role—namely, her money."

Leading Characters

The role of Dexter, Tracy's first husband, will be performed by Frederick Hand. Samuel Kahn will play George, Tracy's second husband. Mike, the newspaper man sent to get "the Philadelphia story" will be portrayed by Clifton Crosbie, and Jean McVicker is cast as Liz, the newspaper's photographer.

Warren S. Smith, associate pro-

fessor of dramatics, will direct the play.

In charge of the crews and their particular jobs are: Shirley Van-Sant, costumes; Millis Marshon, make-up; Ruth Kluger, properties; Caryl Newitt, lights; Martin Devlin, sound; John Krumrine, stage crew; Gerald Denisof, assistant stage crew.

James Broad is stage manager assisted by Malcolm Gable. House manager is Steven Babcock. Russell G. Whaley, instructor in dramatics, designed the set for the production.

Tickets for the play may be obtained at the Hetzel Union Building.
