50 per cent more trophies to help stimulate interest in the "week." The committee also thought the judging of "good taste," "originality," and "adherence to theme," toward winning points was too strong, making tickets count more than they should. Seely suggested to Cabinet that discussion on the recommendations be postponed because they will be taken up at Encampment this fall.

In approving Seely's NSA recommendation, Cabinet automatically approved four Cabinet members as delegates to go to the Student Congress at the University of Minnesota. They are Beard; Samuel Wolcott, sophomore class president; Bruce Lieske, Association of Independent Men president; and Carolyn Cunningham, Woman's Student Government Association president. Harold J. Perkins, assistant dean

Cabinet will meet at 7 p.m. Sunday in 203 Hetzel Union to approve for the second time the allocation of expenses of \$125 each to the four students attending the NSA convention.

This is necessary because allocations of more than \$100 from the Student Government Association treasury must be approved two times under the All-University constitution, Seely said.

itory would not do much to ease the situation which next semester will permit only 34 per cent of the women who applied for admission to enroll at the University.

Plans for increased women's housing facilities, Miss McGowan said, would be a step in the direction of improving poor conditions in the education of women which prevail throughout the state.

Benjamin Sinclair, president of the Board of Dramatics and Forensics, made a motion, which Cabinet passed unanimously, stating that the Student Encampment Committee present a tentative list to Cabinet before Nov. 15, of students who will be invited to the 1956 Encampment.

Philip Beard, All-University secretary-treasurer, brought to Cabinet's attention the fact that money for student activities could not be raised by specifically outlining any definite amount to sup-

port an activity, but must be requested in a lump sum for that activity.

Thus Cabinet left up to the Board of Trustees the choice of assessing each student a special amount for the Penn State Series or getting the money from another source.

The appointments of Julie Mayberry and Harold Dean as co-chairmen of the Secretarian Committee, were approved.

Two changes in the format of the Student Handbook, suggested by Dorothy Stone, editor, were also approved. Miss Stone suggested that a map of the campus be included on the back page, and a change be made in the illustration.

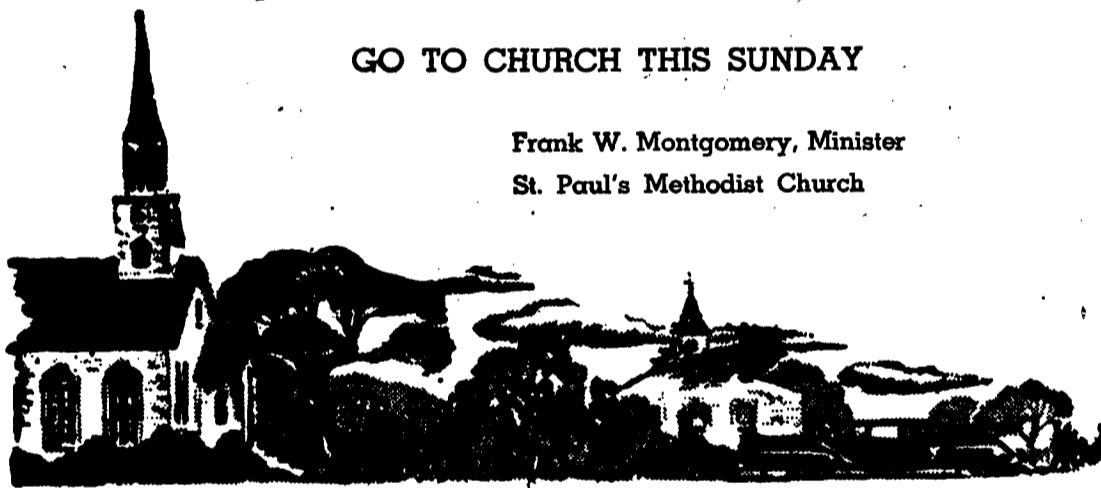
