

45 Women to Participate In Orientation Counseling

The counselors are members of Cwens, sophomore women's hat society; Chimes, junior women's hat society; Mortar Board and Scrolls, senior women's hat societies; and Alpha Lambda Delta, freshman women's scholastic honor society; as well as presidents of Women's Student Government Association, Women's Recreation Association, Leonides, and Panhellenic Council.

The counseling program is designed to help new women students adjust to their new surroundings as quickly as possible.

The presidents of the various women's organizations will help plan original skits to introduce new students to their activities. Alpha Lambda Delta members will explain the purposes of the society and encourage women to strive for scholastic achievements.

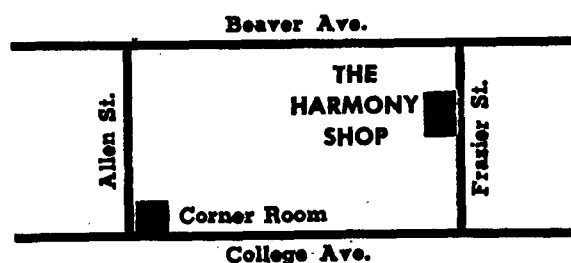
