 man squad for that specific sport. All IM contests are governed by modified rules established by the intramural department. Approximately one out of every four male undergraduate students participates in the program according to last year's statistics. Records show that over 3000 men competed in IM athletics over the course of the year. In 1955, wrestling drew the biggest enrollment for individual competition while basketball was first in team enrollment with 134 entries. Volleyball was second in team entries with 130. Phi Delta Theta earned the All-

Year point award trophy, determined by the total number of points accumulated throughout the year in the various tournaments, with 842.5 points. Sigma Nu finished second with 814 points followed by Beta Theta Pi with 657. In independent activity, the Fireballs, perennial champions for the past three years, successfully retained their coveted crown in touch football. In fraternity volleyball, Delta Chi retained the crown for the second straight year as they defeated Theta Xi in 2 out of 3. Wrestling and boxing prove to be the top crowd getters among the winter events, while track competition gathered the most spectators in the spring.
