

Fraternity Rushing To Start Monday

Formal fraternity rushing will get underway Monday night when freshmen in sections of the West Dorms will meet with Interfraternity Council representatives to discuss aspects of fraternity life.

Sections of the West Dorms scheduled to meet with IFC representatives will be notified during the weekend, Daniel Land, IFC rushing chairman, announced last night.

In addition to Monday night's schedule, discussion groups will be held Thursday night in the remaining sections of the West Dorms and the Nittany-Pollock areas.

Fraternity Life Topics

At the meetings, Land said, IFC representatives will discuss such subjects as the most of living in a fraternity and the advantages of fraternity life.

IFC rushing booklets and fraternity preference cards will be distributed to freshmen.

On Tuesday and Wednesday nights a film, "A Toast To Our Brother" will be shown in 119 Osmond. There will be two showings each night, Land said. The movie will run from 7 to 8:30 p.m., and from 8:30 to 10 p.m.

Prior to each showing of the movie, Land and John Russell, IFC vice president, will address the students.

Open Houses Scheduled

The concentrated rushing program will conclude with fraternity open houses Oct. 23. Each house will conduct student tours in order to better acquaint students with the fraternities.

Another open house is also scheduled for Nov. 13, Land said.

To be eligible to pledge a fraternity, freshmen must have a 2.0 All-University average for the semester previous to pledging. Freshmen are not allowed to pledge during their first semester, and cannot live in a house until their third semester.

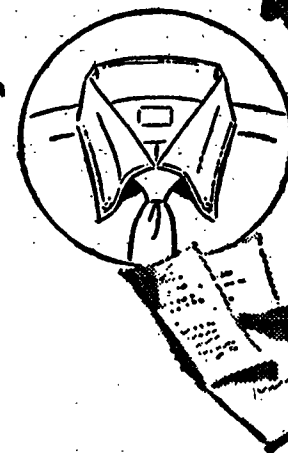

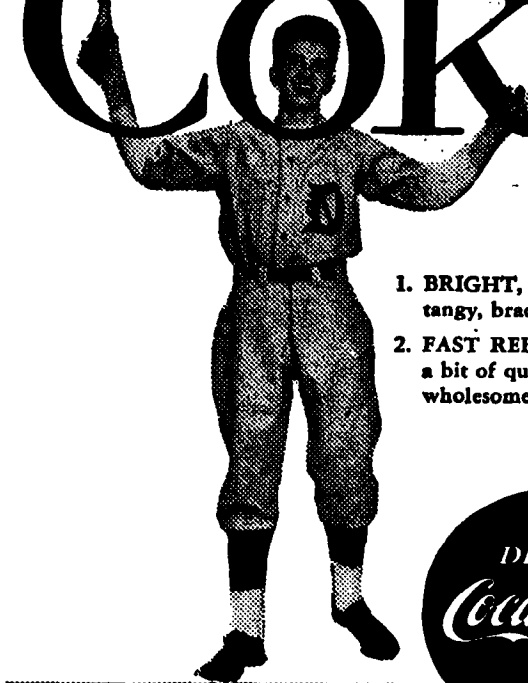
