ing, and are still undergoing changes today, he said. The fraternity men of today are the connecting link of the past and the future of the fraternity system, and are essential to the fraternal chain of progress, Nichol continued.

Mr. Nichol then went on to outline several methods for obtaining better fraternity public relations with others. Promotion of friendship, development of character, diffusion of culture, and advancement of justice were the solutions he offered.

In closing, Mr. Nichol urged the Penn State IFC to look carefully in the mirror and see if its mem-

bers measure up to the suggested standards. If not, he urged them to take steps to arrive at these standards, and apply them to their everyday life.

After Mr. Nichol's address, John M. Russel, vice president of the IFC, presented the national Sigma Chi scholarship trophy to Phi Kappa fraternity. Thomas McGrath, president of Phi Kappa, accepted the trophy on behalf of his fraternity. The trophy is presented annually to the fraternity that shows the greatest improvement in scholarship for the preceding year.

Workshop chairman Samuel Walcott, Delta Upsilon, acted as toastmaster at the banquet. He introduced the workshop personnel, and each gave a brief report on the findings of his committee. The invocation was given by Rev.

Luther H. Harshbarger, University chaplain.

The workshops, a yearly IFC project, are held to discuss various fraternity problems, and air suggestions to these problems. The project was divided into nine discussion groups, attended by representatives from all the fraternities. Suggestions which were proposed at the various group discussions will be published in booklet form and sent around to fraternities at Penn State and other colleges and universities to help them to overcome the problems they face.
