Officials Say Ice Show Unfeasible

Wilmer E. Kenworthy, director of student affairs, said yesterday that he and **Ernest B. McCoy**, dean of the College of Physical Education and Athletics, have agreed that it is not feasible to have an amateur ice show.

The idea for an ice show was originally presented by **Town Independent Men**, who had organized the show into sections.

'Cold Makes It Difficult'

McCoy said it is very difficult to have an audience seated in the cold for the length of time an ice show takes. He also said the rink does not have the proper seating facilities.

McCoy said practice sessions would be hard to schedule because the rink is open to the public most of the possible hours it can be used. He said that profits would be very dubious for an amateur show.

Other Ideas Being Planned

Robert Cole, president of TIM, said the group is working on alternative ideas to take the place of an ice show.

TIM originally planned a full scale amateur ice show, with costumes, lighting, and a large cast. Students would take cast parts, work on choreography, lighting publicity, costumes, and make-up.

Approximately 30 students have signed up for skating parts alone since TIM first announced its intentions.
