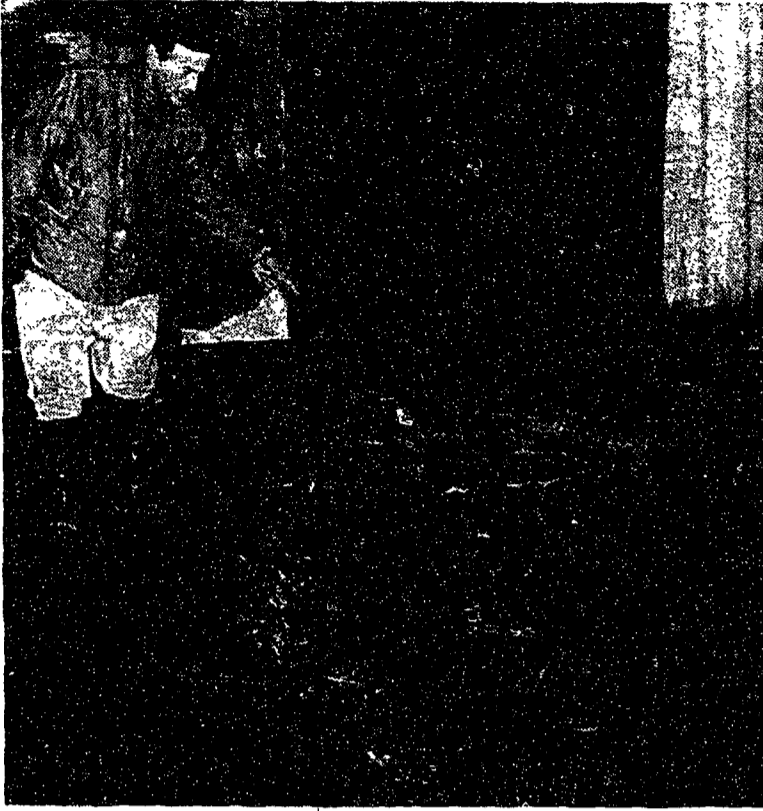


Semester News In Pictures



Floor collapses in Delta Sig fire

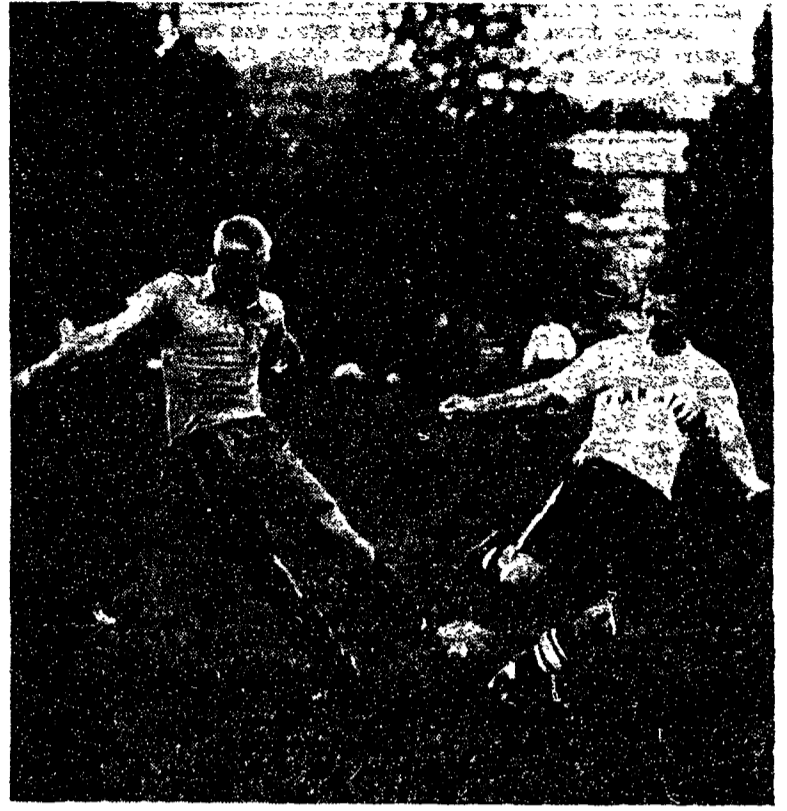
The top news of the semester was wide and varied—from the revival of NSA on campus to the tragic Delta Sigma Phi fire to the national champion soccer team.

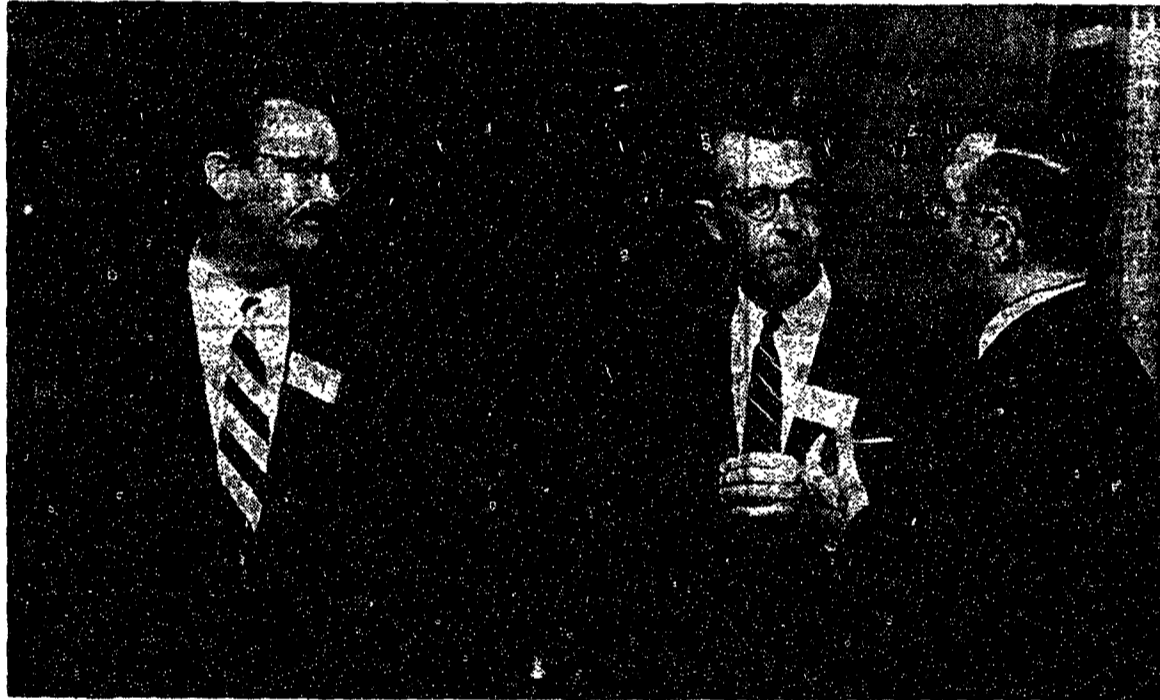
