
Dorm Torn Down

Police said unless the other three men came in voluntarily Browne would be charged with breaking and entering and bur-

The four said before the incident occurred they had been having a bull session and drinking from the bottle which Browne later broke. According to the men, "these things went on all the time among fraternity men and did not violate a sort of unwritten 'Fraternity Code'." They stated that it was a "childish prank" and that no theft was intended.

They emphasized that while their actions might be termed "stealing" or "breaking and entering," the spirit of their activity should make considerable difference and should be taken into ac-count. They said that ordinarily all possessions are subsequently returned following a foray such

as this.

Eschallier said the three felt they had been "coerced" into pleading guilty. He said they had ben advised later by a lawyer that this activity could not be legally designated as burglary or larceny.

He also said that a trail of blood such as police described was "ri-diculous," since Browne's hand was not bleeding that profusely, and a shirt had been wrapped around it and a tourniquet ap-

Eschallier said members of Phi Kappa Tau told him the police had been called when, "one of the fellows lost his head."

Hawke fled from the garage in which he was siphoning gas when a light was switched on, and was traced by his footprints in the snow to his residence, where he was apprehended the next morn ing. He paid a fine of \$100.
