Also under the theatre arts the dance will be developed cooperatively with the department of women's physical education. The faculty members of the school of fine and applied arts are members of the faculty of the Liberal Arts College and as such are eligible for election to the University concerned with these fields.

Under the affiliated departments the department of architecture is still responsible to the dean of the College of Engineering and Architecture, but it shares joint appointments with the department of art.
