Beard justified compensations by saying that students who get appointments from the All-University president are usually students who have worked in activities serving the students for most of their four years at college.

This point was refuted by Lutter who denied that there was any such long tradition of service surrounding Cabinet appointees and added that Cabinet members are not well acquainted with the character and capabilities of the majority of these appointees. "For this," he said, "Cabinet relies on the All-University president."

Bruce Lieske, president of the Association of Independent Men, said that he favored compensations because they were a reward for students who have served the general student body. Students receiving academic scholarships, he said, are actually working only for themselves, but leaders on student government are giving their time for the service of the public.

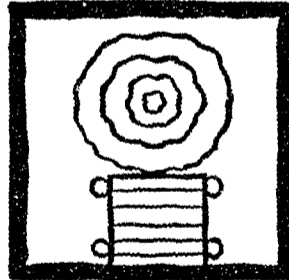

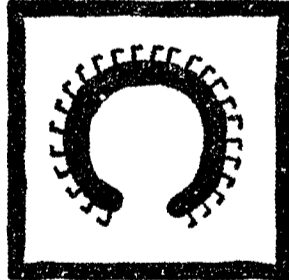
