# Contralto To Sing at 3d Concert

Elena Nikolaidi, prima donna contralto of the Metropolitan Opera Association, will present the third Community Concert program at 8:30 p.m. Thursday in Schwab Auditorium.

Born near Athens, Greece, Miss Nikolaidi was a church soloist at the age of seven. Upon her

graduation from the Athens Conservatory, which she attended on a six-year scholarship, she became soloist with the State Orchestra under the baton of Dimitri Mitropoulos.

A scholarship from the Greek government for study in Vienna led to Miss Nikolaidi's contract with the Vienna Opera. She made her debut in the United States in 1949.

Miss Nikolaidi will sing a program of secular and sacred music, closing with *My Heart at Thy Sweet Voice* from "Samson and Delilah" by Saint-Saens. She will be accompanied at the piano by Robert Evans.

Doors will open for the concert at 8 p.m. Thursday.

Guest soloist will be Elena Nikolaidi. The ticket sale plan is sponsored by the Association of Independent Men.

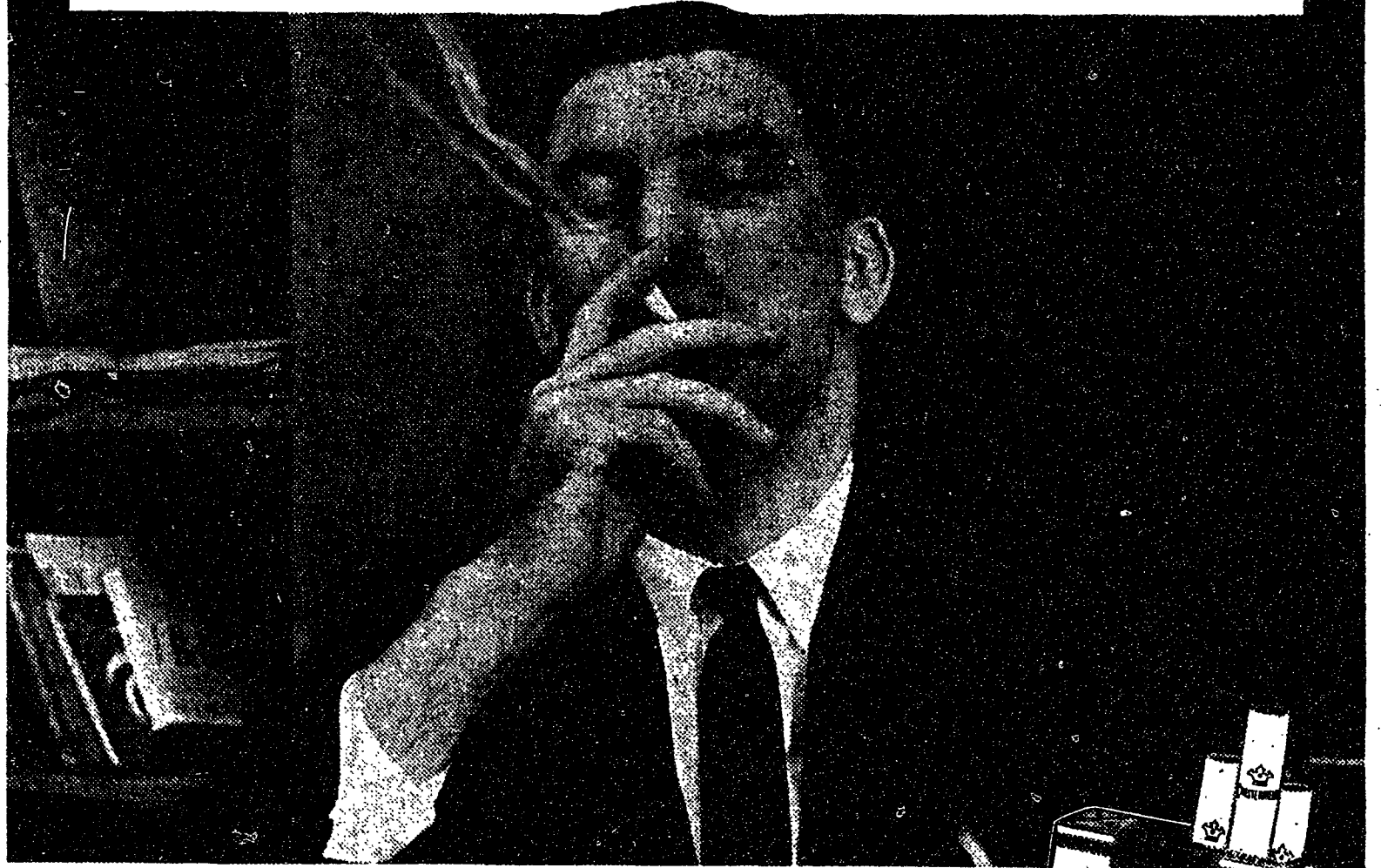

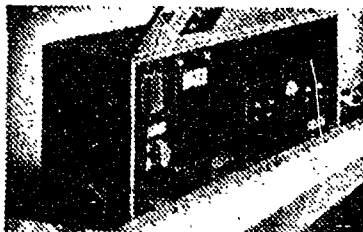

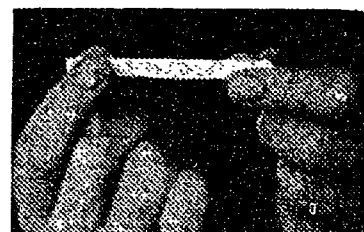
