

Eng College Enrollment Is Largest in University

A total of 2498 undergraduates are enrolled in the College of Engineering and Architecture this semester, giving the college the largest undergraduate enrollment of the nine colleges and schools and the division of intermediate registration at the University.

The School of Education enrolled the largest number of graduate students with 448, and the largest number of special students, 80, are enrolled in the College of the Liberal Arts, according to the spring semester registrar's report.

Following the College of Engineering and Architecture in undergraduate enrollment is the College of the Liberal Arts with 1350 undergraduates.

Total University enrollment for the spring semester has been released as 14,433, a gain of 693 students over a year ago when 13,750 were enrolled but less than last semester's total of 15,352.

Enrollments Are
The colleges, schools, and division of intermediate registration with their undergraduate, graduate, and special enrollment are: the College of Engineering and Architecture, 2498, 119, 13; the College of the Liberal Arts, 1350, 179, 80; the School of Business Administration, 1278, 32, 26.

The School of Education, 1217, 448, 67; the College of Agriculture, 1206, 247, 22; the division of intermediate registration, 769; the College of Home Economics, 678, 64, 15; the College of Chemistry and Physics, 659, 194, 9; the College of Mineral Industries, 433, 182, 8; the College of Physical Education, 228, 34, 6.

Ogontz Leads Centers
According to the registrar's report, Ogontz center has the highest number of student enrollment at a University center with a 586 total.

Other centers and their enrollment are Allentown, 79; Altoona, 339; Behrend, 215; Dubois, 132; Hazleton, 277; McKeesport, 98; Pottsville, 264; Scranton, 66; Wilkes-Barre, 113; York, 106; Mont Alto, 97.

Total off-campus enrollment is 2372.

Phi Mu Alpha will meet at 9 tonight in 117 Carnegie.




