

Dishonesty Rules—

 involving suspension or expulsion from the University.
 The committee doubts that many students will appeal decisions of three faculty members and two students from their own colleges.
 These college disciplinary committees are already existing under the present student conduct program. However, new rule, W-8, delegates more authority and responsibility to the committees than under present regulations. They have been limited to hearing first offenses when no collusion or secret understanding between students are involved.
 The third new rule allows an instructor of a guilty student the means to disenroll the student from the course and give him a grade of "F". The instructor may, with the concurrence of the head of his department, disenroll a student if he wishes, provided he is found guilty.
 Senate also approved the setting up a new Senate subcommittee, the subcommittee on academic discipline. Its formation will be effective if Senate approves it a second time at its next meeting April 5.
 The subcommittee would be made up of the chairman of the 10 college committees on academic discipline. It would meet once a semester to exchange information and study mutual problems related to the functioning of current procedure.

In March of each year, it would present a plan of procedures and policies for the handling of cases of academic dishonesty in "a reasonably uniform manner" for the next academic year to the Senate Committee on Student Affairs.
 The subcommittee's purpose is to eliminate the controversial classification of dishonesty and scheduling of penalties published last semester. This group of chairmen could formulate dishonesty procedures to fit changing conditions. Its provisions would depend on the circumstances and its procedures and policies might or might not include standard penalties.
 The other "W" rules regarding conduct of students in the Senate Regulations were unchanged as were the "M" rules on grades.
 The new rules resulted from dissatisfaction shown by the faculty of the College of Chemistry and Physics to rule 0-3 which requires all cases of dishonesty to be reported to a student's dean through the head of a department and the dean of the college in which the dishonesty was committed.

 much good. Their voices had the best projection in the show and one could actually believe who they should have been.

emotion were false and almost lacking in instances.

 Imagination runs rampant in the tale, especially in the scenes where Todal, an evil "purple light," flashes across the curtains, even singing a song, as done by Ernest Swiggett.
