per cent of the gross receipts from the donkey basketball game ticket sales be paid to the owners of the concession. The committee would be left with very little profit, he said.

Taxes Required

George Donovan also pointed out that under any agreement of this type, the committee would have to pay taxes on the proceeds.

All-University President Earl Seely said that the report was merely a progress report, and points deemed unfeasible were subject to change.

James Musser, reporting on NSA, said the association is presently conducting a student government information service, exchanging data on student activities with the 300 member schools. Musser said he will seek information from other member schools concerning a student book exchange, so it is one of the main topics of discussion at the University today.

The local NSA plans to hold a seminar on the campus in the

near future, composed of students and faculty members, to share the accumulated data on campus affairs and activities of world-wide interest which the NSA feels every student should have some knowledge of, Musser said.

During the regional NSA conference at the University on April 27-29, the "why, when, and where of the NSA" will be explained to the student body, Musser said. Invitations to the conference have been sent out to all member and non-member colleges in Pennsylvania. Approximately 150 delegates are expected to attend the seminar, Musser reported.
