NYU Doctor To Give Talk On Engineering

Dr. Newman A. Hall, head of the graduate division of the College of Engineering at New York University, will speak at 8 tonight in the Mineral Science auditorium.

His subject will be "What Sort of a Profession is Engineering?" The lecture, which is co-sponsored by the College of Engineering and Architecture, is one of the series of Graduate School Lectures and is open to the public.

Dr. Hall was named a research mathematician in 1941 at United Aircraft Corporation and during the next six years with that firm he held positions as supervisor of engineering personnel, power plant analysis engineering, head of the thermodynamics group analysis section, and head of the analysis section.

In 1947 Dr. Hall accepted a position as professor of mechanics engineering at the University of Minnesota and from 1950 until 1955, when he went to New York University, also served as head of the heat power division of the department at Minnesota.

Painting Exhibition To Open Sunday At HUB Gallery

An exhibition of oil paintings by Ernest Krape, of Gettysburg, formerly of Bellefonte, will open Sunday in the gallery of the Hetzel Union Building and continue through April 28.

Krape, a retired interior decorator, became interested in studying art 10 years ago and enrolled in the summer program in water color conducted at the University by Andrew W. Case, professor of fine arts.

He later studied oil painting under Eleanor Zygler, assistant professor of fine arts, and Hobson Pittman, who conducts the summer program in oil painting.

ed by adding together the averages of all the members of the fraternities, and then dividing by the number of members in order to obtain an over-all average.

Method of Computing
The method of computing individual averages consists of totaling the number of grade points a student earns each semester at the University and dividing by the total number of scheduled credits.

Pollock said that during the probation period the fraternities would not be permitted to have dates inside of the house for any reason, but that parents would be permitted in at any time. This ruling would cover Mother's Day.

The fraternities will not be permitted to enter Spring Week, but may enter the Ugly Man contest, he said. The houses will be permitted to hold rushing parties.
