

# UN Asks Israel for Stop-Fire Pledge

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., April 13 (AP)—For the second time in three days UN Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold today asked Israel for assurances that her forces have been forbidden to fire across Egypt's border.

This was Hammarskjold's reply to a demand from Israeli Premier David Ben-Gurion for Hammarskjold to obtain such assurances from Egypt. Hammarskjold reminded Ben-Gurion he had asked for such Israeli assurance, had not received them, and that Egypt has promised to comply fully.

This was disclosed in a series of letters Hammarskjold sent here for circulation to the Security Council.

### Continues Pace

Hammarskjold continued the fast pace he set when he departed last Friday from UN headquarters on a peace mission ordered by the Security Council. The tense Egyptian-Israeli frontier was calm but uneasiness was in the air. Hammarskjold will conclude his talks in Cairo tomorrow and expects to see Ben-Gurion next Tuesday.

Secretary of State John F. Dulles visited New York on personal business and chatted with U.S. Delegate Henry Cabot Lodge Jr., president of the Security Council this month. A delegation source said it was possible they discussed the Middle East but pointed out this was not unusual since they confer each day by telephone.

### Dulles Refuses Comment

Dulles would not comment on a report that the UN Security Council might meet abroad, possibly in Rome, on the Middle East situation.

In New York, 22 youngsters who said they were members of Brith Trumpeldor of America invaded the Park Ave. home of the Egyptian consulate and UN delegation. They chanted and prayed for an hour. They called it a memorial service for the three children and a rabbi "murdered by Egyptian killers near Tel Aviv on Wednesday."

## World at A Glance

### Four Killed in Crash

EAGLES MERE, Pa., April 13 (AP)—A private plane crashed in a woodland during a snow squall today, killing the four occupants.

State police said one piece of wreckage was found a half a mile from the crash scene, indicating the plane may have struck a tree before plunging into the woods.

### GOP's Clash on Taxes

HARRISBURG, April 13 (AP)—Republicans clashed among themselves today on whether the stamp plan for collecting the 3 per cent sales tax should be knocked out of the law.

The system, starting July 1, provides that retailers issue stamps to their customers as a receipt that the tax was paid.

### Ag Bill Awaits Action

WASHINGTON (AP)—The controversial farm bill reached the White House yesterday and the 10 days given President Dwight D. Eisenhower to act began today.

The President can sign or veto, or permit the bill to become law by letting the deadline pass without any action.

## Eisenhower May Explain Ag Bill on TV

AUGUSTA, Ga., April 13 (AP)

—President Dwight D. Eisenhower, mum on reports he has decided to veto the farm bill, may make a nationwide TV-radio address next week to explain whatever action he takes.

As the President awaited the arrival of Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Taft Benson for a conference tomorrow on the controversial election year bill, White House press secretary James C. Hagerty said Eisenhower is thinking about going to the American people on the politically hot issue.

Hagerty cautioned newsmen against concluding that consideration Eisenhower is giving to the idea of a TV-radio talk means necessarily that the President already has made up his mind to veto the bill, which he has called unworkable.

He said Eisenhower may go on the air "whatever action he takes"—whether he signs or vetoes the measure.

## West German Leaders Plan Reunification Move

BONN, Germany, April 13 (AP)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's government plans a direct bid to Soviet Russia soon on behalf of German reunification, his foreign minister said today.

The West Germans say they fear otherwise the Big Four powers, again involved in disarmament talks, may shelve the reunification issue indefinitely.

### Initiative Taken

The foreign minister, Heinrich von Brentano, announced the government will "very soon take the initiative over German reunion through its ambassador in Moscow," Wilhelm Haas. He did not go into detail.

Allied diplomats commented that West Germany is barred under agreements with the West from negotiating with Russia on Germany's unity, but is perfectly free to place its views on the subject before the Russians.

### Haas to Return

Ambassador Haas is in Bonn receiving instructions. He is due to return to Moscow within two weeks — about the time Soviet leaders Nikolai A. Bulganin and Nikita S. Khrushchev will get back from a visit to Britain.

## President Requests Immigration Limit

WASHINGTON, April 13 (AP)—Atty. Gen. Herbert Brownell said today that President Dwight D. Eisenhower proposes a "limited" increase in the number of immigrants. He refused to concede that the number would be doubled.

Brownell, appearing before a Senate Judiciary subcommittee, also objected to a suggestion that under Eisenhower's proposals the "cultural pattern" of immigration would be shifted to southeastern Europe.

Brownell said he did not like the term or know its meaning.
