# Kefauver Leads Early In New Jersey Returns

NEWARK, N.J., April 17 (AP)—Sen. Estes Kefauver ran ahead of President Dwight D. Eisenhower in first returns tonight of the "popularity" phase of New Jersey's presidential primary.

Returns from 179 of 4,155 voting districts, including 152 in heavily-Democratic Hudson County showed:

Kefauver (D.) 9,537.  
Eisenhower (R.) 5,672  
Adlai Stevenson (D.) write-in 7

But a slate of convention delegates pledged to Kefauver trailed an unpledged slate headed by Gov. Robert B. Meyner and backed by the Democratic state organization.

The Republicans had no such contest. A GOP delegate slate pledged to Eisenhower had only token opposition.

The first 12 districts to report in the Democratic delegate contest gave the unpledged slate 28-4 for the Kefauver slate.

Stevenson was not a contender in the New Jersey primary and did not appear in the state during the campaign. His name was not on the ballot.

The unpledged slate generally is regarded as friendly to Stevenson.

# Reds Announce Dissolvment Of Cominform

VIENNA, Austria, April 17 (AP)—Communist authorities announced today they have dissolved the Cominform, the Red information bureau founded after World War II with the aim of promoting world communism.

Once used by Joseph Stalin in fights against the American Marshall Plan and Yugoslavia's President Tito, the nine-nation agency hasn't amounted to much in recent years.

Its major effort has centered on turning out from plush headquarters in Bucharest, Romania, a drab newspaper called "For a Lasting Peace, For a People's Democracy."

Western diplomats said the Communist party members would continue to follow the Soviet line and the reported dissolution would have no practical effect. U.S. State Department experts in Washington called it a cheap gesture by the Soviet leadership to court good will.

# Ike Pushes Civil Rights

WASHINGTON, April 17 (AP)—President Dwight D. Eisenhower bore down tonight on civil rights—but not the Democrats—in a speech summoning the GOP to an election year "crusade" on behalf of "people and principles."

A half dozen times, in one form or another, Eisenhower spoke up for equal opportunities for all people regardless of race or creed, or declared that the GOP "sets up no walls of birth or creed or party."

This was an address to a GOP campaign strategy conference that brought party leaders from over the nation. In effect, it was the opening gun of Eisenhower's own reelection campaign.

# Solons May Save Soil Bank

WASHINGTON, April 17 (AP)—Republican leaders in Congress set out today to salvage the soil bank section of the vetoed farm bill.

President Dwight D. Eisenhower rejected the bill yesterday as "bad" legislation but said Congress could still give the farmers some extra money this year by enacting a separate soil bank

measure. As the GOP leaders went to work on his idea, the Agriculture Department announced this year's cotton crop will be supported at levels reflecting 87 per cent of Parity.

This is in line with the rate virtually promised by Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson to cotton state legislators.

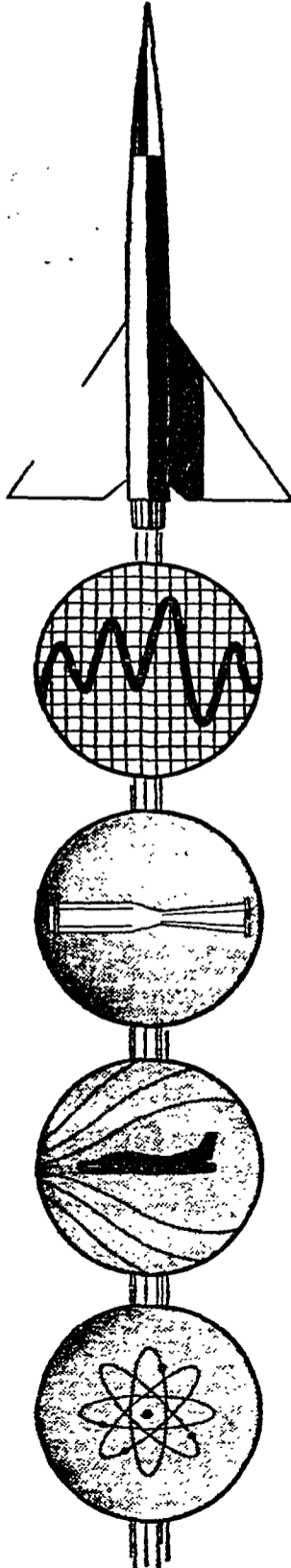
