### Trio to Depict Rivers

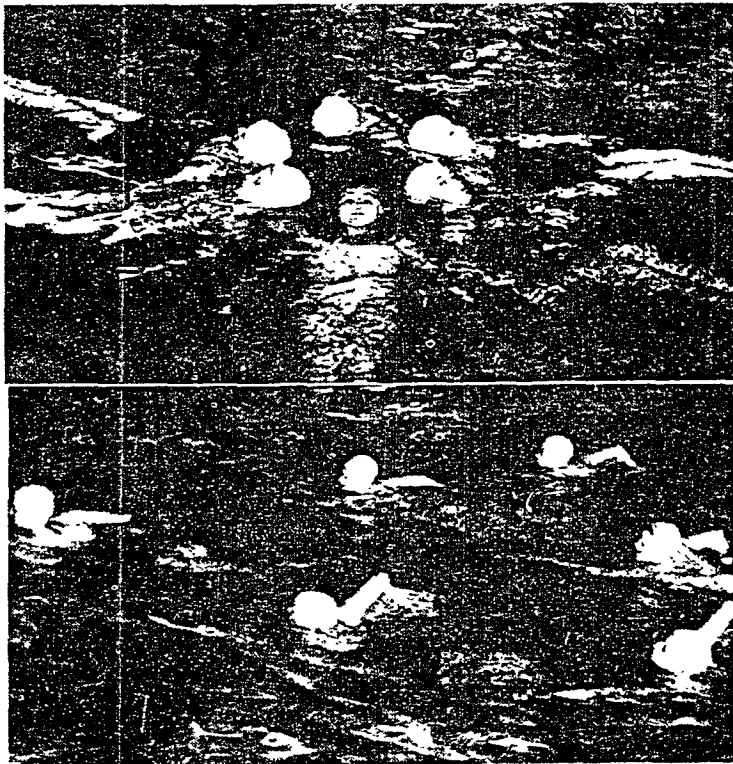
