

NSA Conference Will Begin Friday

The National Student Association Regional Convention will start at 3 p.m. Friday with registration for delegates.

Approximately 130 schools are expected to be represented at the convention according to Barbara Hendel, NSA special arrangements chairman.

Keynote address for the weekend will be given by Stephen H. Fuller, assistant professor of business administration at Harvard University, at 9 a.m. Saturday in the Hetzel Union Assembly room.

Wilmer E. Kenworthy, director of student affairs, will welcome visiting students to the University at 8 p.m. Friday in the assembly room.

Friday's schedule will close with an informal reception at 10 p.m. in the main lounge of the HUB.

ny. The actors as a whole did good jobs. It was an entertaining show.

We will evaluate the actors in the light Stark presented them. The most impressive was Jon Wilder who was magnificent as "Uncle Vanya." He approached most closely the character we think Chekhov wrote—a discouraged, beaten man suffering "unrequited love," who erupts into a passionate hatred for his love's husband, the professor, and at the end relapses into a gloomy dejection.

He looked like a middle or lower class Russian of the turn of the century might look, we imagine. He spoke the part, and he acted the part. In his hate and dejection scenes he may have overacted—but it was hilarious.

As the "dashing" doctor who comes to the professor's country estate to gaze upon the professor's wife in love, Gerald Denisof portrays in Astorff a partially-convincing lover of life and the wildness of forest country. Tall and with a facial expression-hiding mustache, he leaves one major impression: hooked hands under the armpits.

Robert Reifsnider, an associate professor of theater arts, played his role of the spirited and disliked professor to the hilt. Playing for a line a laugh, except for one scene of pain and depression, he came across very strongly. We think the part was grossly misinterpreted but in playing for laughs he was great.
