New Society Elects Steen President

Joel Steen, senior in mechanical engineering from Huntingdon Valley, was elected president of the University's section of the American Rocket Society, a newly-formed campus group, Tuesday.

The local section of the society was organized May 3 by Dr. Harold M. Hipsh, professor of aeronautical engineering, to conduct organized research into all fields involving jet propulsion. Membership is open to students in all scientific curriculums who can meet the requirements of the national group.

Other officers elected were Rex Morrison, vice president; Edward Karnowski, treasurer; David Brode, corresponding secretary; Richard McKuitt, recording secretary; John Carpenter, director of propulsion; Richard Shingler, director of guidance; Frederick Evans, director of structures; and Robert Wisner, director of aero-medicine.

Steen said last night that he expects the organization to eventually become the largest technical society on campus because it has a broader base from which to draw members and a wider divergence of activity.

Membership Reaches 100

He also stated that the membership has jumped to about 100 in the two weeks of the organization's existence.

Nationally, the society's membership includes leaders from all walks of industrial life. The organization holds an annual convention in conjunction with the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

The winners received silver debate gavels.
