

### Oil Well Company Gives Two Awards To Petroleum Prof

Dr. C. Drew Stahl, assistant professor of petroleum and natural gas engineering, has been awarded a plaque and \$400 by the American Association of Oil Well Drilling Contractors.

The award is made each year to a college or university professor who has been instrumental in interesting engineering students in the techniques of drilling for oil. This is the first time the award has been made to a Penn State faculty member.

Presentation of the award was made Tuesday night at a joint meeting of Pi Epsilon Tau, petroleum engineering honorary, and the Petroleum Engineering Society, after a lecture by H. J. Wagner, of the Delta Drilling Co. Dr. Stahl has served on the Penn State faculty since 1947.

**Penalty Would Be Closure**  
The recommended penalty for violation of this law would be immediate closure of the violating booth.

During this year's carnival, three booths were found with empty beer bottles, and one booth with beer. If the addition is made to the carnival rules, it will clear up indecision as to whether a group has been using alcoholic beverages or just using containers by prohibiting both.

**Donkey Basketball Backed**  
Two final general recommendations will be made asking the continuance of the Donkey Basketball Game, which was tried this year for the first time, and establishment of the Spring Week committee early in October to facilitate the large amount of correspondence which must be carried on early to secure certain services.

The report also earmarks \$4400 to \$4500 for operating expenses in next year's Spring Week, and an estimated \$1300 gift to the Penn State Student Scholarship Fund. Last year, Spring Week donated \$1600 to the fund.

**Cabinet Progress Report**  
The final report to Cabinet will enumerate the progress made during the year by Cabinet. The report will be used as a reference for future Student Encampments, Bahrenburg said. This will eliminate wasting time on issues which have already been investigated, he added.

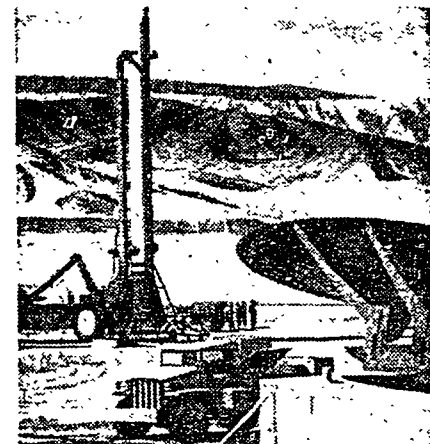

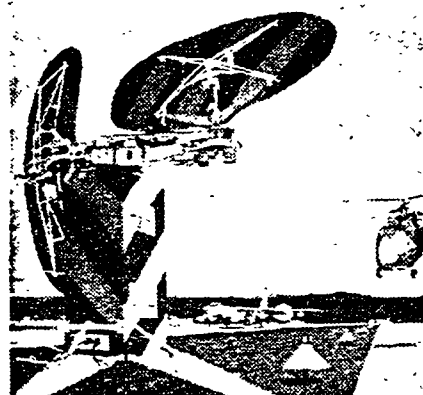
