

6 Coeds to Compete For County Title

Six coeds will be among the twelve contestants to vie for Miss Centre County, a preliminary elimination for the Miss America contest, tomorrow night at 8 p.m. in Bellefonte High School Auditorium.

Contestants from the University are Patricia Reno, freshman in arts and letters from Forest Hills, Gloria Ward, freshman in arts and letters from State College, Arlene Kondor, freshman in arts and letters from Morrisville, Carol Braun, sophomore in home economics from Newton Square, Rosemary Keating, sophomore in home economics from Wilkes-Barre, and Diane Daniels, junior in arts and letters from Pittsburgh.

14 Students Fined Record Amount By Traffic Court

Fourteen persons were fined a total of \$94 by the University Traffic Court last night. It was the highest amount in fines levied by the Court this year.

Twenty-two persons appeared before the Court. Five cases were dismissed.

Of the fines, \$83 were for parking violations and \$11 for failure to report to the Campus Patrol office. Ten dollars in fines was suspended by the Court.

Seven persons failed to appear before the Court, thereby forfeiting their right to appeal. They were automatically fined a total of \$35.

The highest individual fine was \$25 for six parking violations and six failures to report to Traffic Court.

Last night's meeting of the Traffic Court was the last of the year, according to Richard Kurtz, member of the court.

The contestants will wear evening gowns and ride in convertibles in a parade preceding the competition, which begins at 6:30 p.m.

The parade, which is also in Bellefonte, will begin on lower High St., go up High to Spring, south on Spring to Bishop, from Bishop to Allegheny, and on Allegheny to the school.

Each Part Counts a Third The entries will be judged in evening gown, bathing suit, and on talent. Each division will count one third in the judging.

Miss Reno will do a baton twirling routine. Miss Kondor a modern ballet, Miss Keating a dramatic reading, and Miss Braun a monologue. Miss Daniels will sing and Miss Ward will display her art work.

The contest is patterned after the national pageant in all respects. The song Miss America and other music for the event will be provided by Keystoneaires, orchestra of the Bellefonte American Legion Junior Band, directed by Owen Butt. Charles Flynn of WFBG-TV in Altoona will be

master of ceremonies.

Scholarship to Be Awarded

Tickets are on sale in the Music Room, at the Hetzel Union desk, and at the door of the auditorium. The price is 50 cents.

Doors of the auditorium will open at 7:30 p.m.
